KYSR provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **Allergy Information:** Interview with Dr. Marc Tamaroff: Allergy season is already upon us and the balmy temperatures of recent days from a series of weather patterns are a strong reminder that the time to take preventative measures is now. With the presence of El Nino spring allergy season is expected to be worse than ever because of the wet weather and healthy root systems in trees. According to the American College of Allergy, Asthma and Immunology Asthma and allergic diseases, such as allergic rhinitis (hay fever), food allergy, and atopic dermatitis (eczema), are common for all age groups in the United States. Asthma affects more than 17 million adults and more than 7 million children. Allergies are the 6th leading cause of chronic illness in the U.S. with an annual cost in excess of \$18 billion. More than 50 million Americans suffer from allergies each year.
- **Arts for the Public:** Interview with Adelaida Renteria and Erin Stone: 11:11 A Creative Coalition (ACC) was formed independently in 2009 by four individuals who noticed a need for a cohesive and collaborative art community within the San Fernando Valley, CA. With a population of close to two million people, these four individuals became aware that cultural activity was found in the areas surrounding The San Fernando Valley, leaving their home town void of a groundbreaking, inspired and an active artistic community. Their vision is to inspire and affirm the importance of a developed, cohesive and accessible artistic community and to assure readily available and affordable resources for aspiring and emerging artists. They aim to accomplish this purpose by supporting and promoting funding for artists and art. Coming up on Saturday June 4th from 5:00 pm - 10:00 pm, 11:11 ACC is hosting the Reseda Artwalk and Night Market is a one night event promoting beautification, revitalization and activation of the Great Streets Sherman Way corridor in Reseda. Located on Sherman Way between Etiwanda & Lindley, The Reseda Artwalk and Night Market is a family friendly event and a perfect excuse to bring out the kids and pups to enjoy the neighborhood!
- **Assault Treatment:** Interview with Joni Novosel: "Center for Assault Treatment Services" (CATS) and is a program of Dignity Health" Northridge Hospital Medical Center and has been serving

the area since August 1997. CATS is the only 24-hour, 7-day-per-week member of the only designated domestic abuse and Sexual Assault Response Team in the San Fernando and Santa Clarita Valleys providing the highest level of evidence collection services. CATS staff all has advanced training as Forensic Nurse Examiners for adult and child interviews and is dedicated to treating children and adults affected by violence. On April 17th come out to Woodley/ Lake Balboa Park in Encino and attend the 14th annual "Victory For Victims" 5K/10K Walk/Run to support CATS! Proudly supporting and attending this event will be Olympic Gold Medalist Rafer Johnson and other featured guests. - **Cancer Awareness:** Interview with Lisa Manheim: The 4th Annual Tour de Pier fundraising event returns to the Southbay on Sunday, May 15. The award-winning stationary cycling event makes its way back to the iconic Manhattan Beach Pier benefiting three cancer charities: the Hirshberg Foundation for Pancreatic Cancer Research; the Cancer Support Community Redondo Beach and the Uncle Kory Foundation. The Tour de Pier brings one of the hottest indoor fitness activities "stationary cycling" to the gorgeous outdoors. Participants will be overlooking the Manhattan Beach Pier and riding in place while taking in the historic Southern California ocean view.

- **Cancer Research:** Interview with President Derek Alpert and Executive Board Chairperson Ilyse Teller: Concern Foundation's mission is to conquer cancer by providing essential funds to support the early yet critical stages of discovery. Since its inception in 1968, Concern has raised and awarded \$58 million to 750 gifted cancer scientists around the world. For 48 years, Concern has pioneered the advancement of cancer immunology "the study of the relationship between the immune system and cancer" a field that is now widely acknowledged to hold the most potential for discovering treatments and preventions for cancer. On Saturday July 9 at 6 p.m., Concern Foundation for cancer research will host its 42nd annual Block Party fundraiser at Paramount Pictures Studios in Hollywood, CA. This year's theme, Fields of Dreams for a cancer free world, will celebrate a carefree country lifestyle. The event aims to attract nearly 4,000 guests and raise \$2 million to fund research focused on immunology based methods for treating cancer.
- **Child Illness:** Interview with Marchelle Sellers and David A. Kulber, MD: Mending Kids gives sick kids life-saving surgical care while advancing education and training towards medical self-sufficiency in their communities. Their work has been done, to date, in 57 countries, including the United States. Most of the surgeries provided correct congenital heart defects, orthopedic abnormalities, severe scoliosis, urological defects, and facial deformities.
- **Childhood Cancer Awareness:** Interview with Desiree Castellano: On February 14, 2007, at the age of seven, Talia Joy Castellano was diagnosed with neuroblastoma, a rare form of childhood cancer. After three relapses and a diagnosis of the secondary cancer, MDS/preleukemia, Talia continued to fight two forms of cancer. She continued treatments knowing there was no cure, but hoped to slow down the progression to prolong her life. After six and a half years, on July 16, 2013 at 11:22am, Talia Joy Castellano lost her battle to childhood cancer. During her life, Talia was an inspiration to everyone she met. She came up with the motto "Makeup Is My Wig," and started a YouTube channel under the username "Taliajoy18." One her channel she made makeup tutorials videos and vlogs that shed light on her cancer. After her passing, Talia's mom Desiree and sister Mattia Talia's Legacy Children's Cancer Foundation to carry out Talia's wishes to leave her footprints and hand prints on this world so she will never be forgotten. One of the major programs at Talia's Legacy is Glam Wars. Glam Wars is a program that teaches young girls how to apply makeup to help them feel empowered while fighting childhood cancer. There is a Glam Wars event coming up on May 13th at LA Children's Hospital!
- **Children's Health & Education:** Interview with Diane Levin: First 5 California was created by voters under Proposition 10 to recognize that children's health and education is a top priority, especially in the early years of development. Research shows 90 percent of a child's brain develops in the first five years of life. Making those years count is what First 5 California is all about. Their focus is to educate parents and caregivers about the important

role they play in their children's first years. Since 1998, First 5 California has invested millions of dollars to design comprehensive programs that address the needs of children ages 0 to 5 and their families. Currently, their programs are centered around the child, parent, and teacher to improve early childhood outcomes in the areas of health and nutrition, early literacy and language development, quality child care, and smoking cessation.

- **Community Empowerment:** Interview with Michelle Miranda: Alliance for Community Empowerment (ACE) is a nonprofit community based organization that is committed to rebuilding communities by providing education, vocational training and social development, while creating community partnerships in order to generate a collective impact. Michelle Miranda Executive Director and CEO, of Alliance for Community Empowerment (ACE) is being honored by the City of Los Angeles Commission On the Status of Women and Council Member Bob Blumenfield as the 2016 Pioneer Woman of the Year! Ms. Miranda is being recognized for her remarkable lifework of championing gender equity that has enriched the lives of women and girls.
- **Disease Prevention:** Interview with Catherine Martin: The California Immunization Coalition is a non-profit, public-private partnership dedicated to achieving and maintaining full immunization protection for all Californians to promote health and prevent serious illness. The Coalition provides networking and partnership opportunities for you and your organization and offers access to greater expertise by calling on a wide range of organizations and individuals. The Coalition has the ability to leverage resources and can advocate for change at the state, regional and local levels. This year, there have been several cases of Meningitis B on college campuses. In February, three Santa Clara University students contracted Meningitis B as well as one Yale student was identified to have the disease. While many of us have been vaccinated with meningitis as children, many of us don't know that there are two strains of the disease with two different vaccinations. A new vaccine for meningitis was approved by the FDA last December and few people know about it.
- **Dog Rescue:** Interview with Sydney Brown and Kathleen Aharonian: Chews Life Dog Rescue is an organization dedicated to giving all breeds of dogs the proper treatment and love they deserve. They save dogs off of the streets and from local animal shelters and put them into loving homes. Although they do currently not have boarding or kennel facilities, all of their dogs are in foster care. Chews Life Dog Rescue was founded by a group of dog lovers in Los Angeles, CA. They are dedicated to re-homing and providing love to dogs from local high kill shelters, abandoned strays, and neglected dogs of all breeds. They are primarily based in Los Angeles but also work in Orange and San Diego County.
- **Eating Disorder Support:** Interview with Nadia Meija: National Eating Disorder Association (NEDA) supports individuals and families affected by eating disorders, and serves as a catalyst for prevention, cures and access to quality care. NEDA believes that overcoming an eating disorder takes professional help, but it

is also important to have a strong support team. Whether you have been personally affected by an eating disorder or care about someone who has, NEDA's programs and services are designed to help you find the help and support you need. Nadia Mejia, a model and the 2016 Miss California winner, is also a very involved with NEDA. After struggling with anorexia for 2 years and then overcoming the disorder, Nadia has become a spokesperson for NEDA and travels around giving speeches to young girls about loving their bodies!

- **Education:** Interview with Laura Benvidez: Los Angeles Unified School District and Healthy Schools Campaign are kicking off the Cooking up Change culinary competition. The District competition will take place on April 8 at LA Trade Tech. Cooking up Change is a dynamic culinary competition that challenges high school students in cities across the nation to create healthy, appealing school meals. Winning teams compete in the national finals and present their meals to Congress! The winners of the LAUSD competition will go on for an all-expense paid trip to the national competition in Washington, DC in June at the US Department of Education. A version of the winning recipes will also be served at the District's cafeterias and to Congress in DC.
- **Environmental Conservation:** Interview with Philippe Cousteau: EarthEcho International's mission is to inspire young people worldwide to act now for a sustainable future. They are a nonprofit organization founded in 2000 by siblings Philippe and Alexandra Cousteau in honor of their father Philippe Cousteau Sr., son of the legendary explorer Jacques Yves Cousteau. Philippe Sr's belief in a world where every single child can breathe fresh air, drink clean water, and walk on green grass under a blue sky serves as their vision to this day. EarthEcho's approach is simple, their 21st century tools and interactive resources equip youth to identify and solve environmental challenges starting in their own communities. With Earth Day coming up on April 22nd, their mission is all the more important.
- **Female Hair Loss Support:** Interview with Amy Gibson: The Voice of Women's Hair Loss, Amy Gibson is the country's leading wig designer and hair loss consultant to women suffering with cancer, alopecia and other related conditions. She is an author, nationally recognized speaker, alopecia activist, Emmy nominated soap opera star and founder of CreatedHair.com and Salons, a company established to offer women across the globe a solid resource for coping with the effects of hair loss, as well as assisting those seeking to renew their appearance, self-esteem and radiant healthfulness. The Founding Chapter of the Worldwide Cancer Support Community, The Benjamin Center of West Los Angeles, is proud to present Amy's Power Wig Workshop by Amy Gibson on Tuesday, May 24, 2016.
- **Foster Care:** Interview with Charito Guerrero: Penny Lane Centers is a nonprofit organization that cares for over 3500 abused and neglected children, youth and families a month. They provide therapeutic residential services, foster family home placements, adoption services, transitional and affordable housing, family

preservation, wraparound and mental health services for children youth and families throughout Los Angeles County. Their mission is to foster hopes and dreams by empowering children, youth and families to reach their highest potential.

- **Homeless Support:** Interview with Athena Haley and Danielle Foster: Love My Neighbor Foundation has a mission of establishing a viable and respectable means for homeless individuals to receive the necessities of life as they regain their way back into society. Love My Neighbor, is not just another foundation giving away food, clothes etc. This foundation was established to allow homeless individuals to keep their pride and dignity as they receive food, clothing, shoes, toiletries and spiritual enlightenment. Their volunteers are individuals in the community that realize the plight of the homeless and display such by giving countless hours to ensure their comfort when distributing necessities. The money raised will help continue to feed and clothe the homeless, weekly, and also goes to getting a van for the charity. In return, this event will help companies and their campaigns to leverage exposure to an incredible base of consumers whose demographics are a perfect fit.
- **Mastectomy Information:** Interview with Nimmi S. Kapoor, M.D.: Nimmi S. Kapoor, M.D. is a surgical oncologist who practices at Breastlink Laguna Hills and Breastlink Orange.
