KYSR provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- Alzheimer's Awareness: Interview with Charles J. Fuschillo: The mission of the Alzheimer's Foundation of America (AFA) is "to provide optimal care and services to individuals confronting dementia, and to their caregivers and families-through our member organizations dedicated to improving quality of life. The Alzheimer's Foundation of America (AFA) was founded by a consortium of organizations to fill the gap that existed on a national level to assure quality of care and excellence in service to individuals with Alzheimer's disease and related illnesses, and to their caregivers and families.
- Autism Awarenes: Interview with Jennifer Jones: On Sunday December 6th Autism Speaks is holding The OC Walk Now For Autism Speaks.
- Breast Exams: Interview with Nimmi S. Kapoor: Nimmi S. Kapoor, M.D. is a surgical oncologist who practices at Breastlink Laguna Hills and Breastlink Orange. Dr. Kapoor graduated summa cum laude from UCLA and went to medical school at Weill Cornell Medical College. "I joined Breastlink because I believe this is a group of highly qualified providers who are truly dedicated to patient care while going aboveand-beyond the standard of care. This is a sophisticated center with access to cutting-edge research, top-notch equipment and efficient technology." Dr. Kapoor came in to our studio to give information on breast cancer exams and to clarify when women should start getting routine breast exams.
- **Cancer Support:** Interview with Cynthia Keyllian: Beads For Battle is an organization that makes bracelets for cancer patients to show solidarity.
- Child Illness: Interview with Taylor Gunin: Make A Wish Foundation is having a fundraiser on October 24th at BESO's Hollywood.
- **Coat Drive**: Interview with Patricia Zappa: One Warm Coat's mission is to provide anyone in need with a warm coat, free of charge. The organization started in 1992 with a Thanksgiving weekend coat drive at one location in San Francisco. Since then, they have grown to a national organization supporting over 3,000 coat drives each year. The need for a warm winter coat is very real. Health experts report that even a 2-degree drop in body temperature results in reduced heart rate,

loss of coordination, and confusion. Adults cannot work effectively and children find it difficult to learn. For most, a warm coat solves the problem. But, for the nearly 15% of Americans living in poverty, a warm winter coat is a budget extra.

- Down Syndrome Research: Interview with Michelle Sie Whitten: The Global Down Syndrome Foundation is dedicated to significantly improving the lives of people with Down syndrome through Research, Medical Care, Education and Advocacy. Formally established in 2009, Global's primary focus is to support the Linda Crnic Institute for down syndrome, the first academic home in the United States committed solely to research and medical care for people with Down syndrome. Since Down syndrome is the least-funded genetic condition in the United States, fundraising and government advocacy to correct the alarming disparity of national funding for people with Down syndrome is a major goal.

- Drug and Alcohol Abuse: Interview with Danielle Olson: Founded in 2015, The Lisa Michelle Memorial Fund was created to honor the life of Lisa Michelle Miller who passed away on September 20, 2008 due to her addiction to prescription drugs. The LMM Fund provides scholarships to students who have lost a parent to drug, alcohol, or prescription drug abuse. The leadership team also works with organizations that provide services to families coping with this type of addiction and loss. In 2006, Ryan reached out to his church and a local school for help and "Wish Upon A Toy" was born! The response was overwhelming and the "Wish Upon A Toy"

was a tremendous success! Each year since then they have continued to grow to include drop off locations at local churches, restaurants, U.S. banks, Targets, and Carmax locations, plus an online donation campaign raising thousands of dollars throughout the years.
