KYSR provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- 5K Fundraiser Walk: Interview with Whitney N. Alston: The Jerome Alston Memorial Foundation (JAMFoundation) is a nonprofit organization that was founded in December 2013. Their mission is to be concerned about the health, welfare and educational development of young males.
