KYSR provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- ADHD: As you may or may not know, October is ADHD Awareness Month "a topic that hits home for countless individuals and families in the US. CRN has teamed up with Dr. Hallowell (a child/adult psychiatrist, New York Times best-selling author, and speaker/authority in ADHD) to create the podcast, Distraction. Together they are devoting all eight episodes in October to clearing up misconceptions and providing unique insights about ADHD in celebration of ADHD Awareness Month.
- Autism Awareness & Walk-a-thon: Join Autism Speaks Los Angeles and over 55 thousand autism advocates as they walk to raise money and awareness to help change the future for all of those who struggle with autism spectrum disorder. Participating in this inspiring day empowers you to make a difference in our community and provides you with an opportunity to honor someone with autism. On December 4th, 2016, the Autism Speaks Walk Orange County will take place at Angel Stadium of Anaheim. Come out to help raise crucial funds to support vital research, programs, and services that are changing the future for those who are impacted by autism.
- Breast Cancer Awareness: Susan G. Komen is an organization with the mission to save lives by meeting the most critical needs in our communities and investing in breakthrough research to prevent and cure breast cancer. With the help of volunteers and donors, they're having a real impact against breast cancer. October was breast cancer awareness month, a time to educate the public on breast cancer and raise money for a cure. Sharon Spencer Schlesinger came into our studios to let the public know what Susan G. Komen is doing now that breast cancer awareness month is over!
- Cancer Awareness: Following in the footsteps of the highly developed and successful Teenage Cancer Trust, Teen and Young Adult Cancer Program out of the UK, Teen Cancer America is designed to help hospitals and healthcare professionals bridge the gap between pediatric and adult oncology care. Teen Cancer America aims to educate and support hospitals and outpatient facilities in the development of specialized units for this age

group. The units are a place just for teens and young adults where the cancer experience is understood and the importance of living life through the cancer journey is nourished.

- Cerebral Palsy Awareness: Using some paint and her painting materials, Sasha has become quite the philanthropist, raising thousands of dollars for Children's Hospital Los Angeles. Sasha, who has been challenged with Cerebral Palsy since birth, is quiet and soft spoken, but her painted jeans speak volumes. With the help of her parents, Sasha came up with the idea to create The Sasha Project LA, where for a donation she'll custom paint your jeans or any denim item. All proceeds will support the art therapy programs (including Hand Heroes Occupational Therapy) at Children's Hospital Los Angeles.
- Child Illness: Make A Wish Foundation has a mission to grant the wishes of children with life-threatening medical conditions. Some people may think that Make-A-Wish grants wishes only to terminally ill kids. But in fact, they grant wishes to medically eligible children who have been diagnosed with a life-threatening illness. They serve over 130,000 meals each year to homeless and impoverished individuals, providing them with stability and a platform on which to rebuild their lives. Their mission is to uplift the urban core of Long Beach; to give a sense of value and dignity to our community; and to enhance the quality of life through food, empowerment, education and support.
- COMMUNITY SUPPORT: Los Angeles Trial Lawyers' Charities (LATLC) is a great organization that provides financial assistance to needy persons and groups in the greater Los Angeles area. The organization focuses on issues related to education, children, battered women, persons with disabilities, and homelessness in Los Angeles. LATLC was founded in 2006 by a group of seven plaintiff personal injury attorneys practicing within the greater Los Angeles Area. LATLC has grown from the original seven founders to an organization of more than 1,800 supporters. This year LATLC is teaming up with KIIS FM & Youth Mentoring to host the 2016 Miles of Music 5K!
- Dental Clinic: The West Coast University Dental Hygiene Clinic is a community resource to improve the oral health of those it serves. All patient care is provided by dental hygiene students under the direct supervision of our expert faculty dental hygienist and dentists. They provide a range of oral care services from routine checkups and cleanings to treating oral disease. All services are to those who qualify to be a patient. For those who do not qualify, they provide a referral list of options for flow-up dental care.
- Domestic violence: Meathead Movers, the student athlete moving company committed to a superior employee and client-centric moving experience, is joining forces with another leading Orange County domestic violence prevention nonprofit Human Options, to move victims of domestic violence out of abusive situations for free. This most recent partnership furthers Meathead Movers' own #MoveToEndDV pledge to help victims of domestic violence.

 Meathead Movers and Human Options are jointly dedicated to the safety of the victims and are poised to immediately take action for victims and their families in need.
- Driving Safety: Halloween is fast approaching and people are preparing to dress up, host parties and visit haunted houses, and many party-goers will often have drink or two either before or during the festivities. Unfortunately, Halloween night is also known as a particularly deadly night due to the high number of drunk drivers on the roads and the increase in pedestrians during the evening hours. This is crucial to remember while we head into the Halloween season.
- Education: After-School All-Stars, Los Angeles (ASAS-LA) has a mission is to educate, enlighten, and inspire young people by providing exciting and dynamic opportunities for their success, while cultivating students' self-esteem, leadership and respect for one another to help build healthier communities. Their vision

for their All-Stars is that they grow up safe and healthy, graduate high school and go on to college, find (or create) careers they love, and give back to their communities. Founded in 2002 by Arnold Schwarzenegger, ASAS-LA serves over 14,000 students annually and average 6,000 students a day at 48 school sites (29 middle schools, 11 elementary schools, two K-8th, one K-12th, five high schools) throughout the Los Angeles County and Lucerne Valley. 99% of their students are youth of color and 88% qualify for the Federal Free and Reduced Meal Program. ASAS-LA is a part of a national network that is comprised of 20 chapters in 13 states and Washington, DC. ASAS operates in 356 Title I schools and serves over 75,000 students annually. There are national headquarters in both Los Angeles and Washington, DC.

- Employment: National Career Fairs has been bringing the best employers together with the best candidates for the job for over 15 years. Their mission is straight to the point; they want to help America get back to work. NCF career fairs are the best in the nation and have helped more people get hired through their events than any other company out there. On October 6th from 11:00 am 2:00 pm at the Atrium Hotel, NCF will be hosting their Irvine Job Fair!
- Environment Education: New law ACR 160 is proof that indeed one student really CAN make a difference! Earlier this year, a California statewide Resolution inspired by Grades of Green Youth Corps student, Antonio, officially passed in support of No Idle Zones for all California schools. The result? 6 million California students could soon be breathing cleaner air. After championing Grades of Green's No Idle Zone Activity at his school in Long Beach, then 8th grader (now an 11th grader) Antonio worked with Grades of Green, who introduced him to partnering organizations such as the Coalition for Clean Air and the South Coast Air Quality Management District, and then to California Assembly member David Hadley to take No Idle Zones to the state level. Assembly member Hadley sponsored ACR 160 to encourage all California schools to create No Idle Zones around their school campuses. The state Resolution passed on the Senate floor on August 1, 2016 and is now law. No Idle Zones encourage parents to turn off their car engine while waiting in school pick-up lines, resulting in better air quality and decreased emissions. We're incredibly proud of Grades of Green student Antonio for his passion and dedication to create a healthier school environment through No Idle Zones. This Resolution will ultimately lead to better air quality for 6 million California students, a pretty impressive accomplishment for one student said Kim Lewand Martin, Co-Founder and Executive Director of Grades of Green.
- Family Services: Badge of Heart is an organization with a focus on providing resources to our Officers who come across deserving families and victims of crimes. Everyday Los Angeles Police Officers respond to approximately 5,000 calls for service, which means continuous interactions with the public. Officers see many situations, where good hard working families and Victim needing assistance. Many working parents and families working several jobs to make ends meet. So often, it's not enough. Badge of Heart

desires to connect Officers with the proper aid to help other families with financial burdens. They strive not only to give relief, but to show compassion to the deserving people of our community. On Saturday, November 19th, Badge of Heart is hosting their 2nd Annual Turkey Drive! Five hundred deserving low income families from the West part of Los Angeles will be receiving Turkeys. These families will be identified by our local LAPD Officers from Pacific Division along with our local Churches and Schools.

- Health & Wellness: The 7th Annual Glendale Health Festival will take place on November 5th, 2016, from 10 am to 3 pm at the Pacific Edison Community Center (501 S. Pacific Ave), Glendale. This festival is a free event and is open to the entire community. The Glendale Health Festival is organized much like a visit to your doctor's office. You start at the triage area; volunteers take pertinent information from participants and make recommendations about available health screenings and services. Participants will have blood pressure, cholesterol and blood sugar measurements taken and then sit down with a licensed physician who will make individualized recommendations. If there are specialty questions, an army of specialty physicians, such as Cardiologists, Neurologists, Podiatrists, etc., will be on-site to make recommendations. Licensed eye care specialists will be on-site to perform eye screenings and indicated dilated eye exams. Participants can visit our dental screening area for an evaluation and consultation with licensed dentists. Breast cancer and cervical cancer screenings will also be offered to appropriate patients. CPR training will be offered by certified educators as well as flu shots will be administered on-site. In addition, education for the whole family will be available on conditions such as high blood pressure, diabetes, obesity, proper nutrition, heart disease, cancer awareness, and more. The festival will have activities for kids and families and will be providing healthy lunches, including chicken, rice, vegetables, along with fruit and bottled water all free of charge. Ample, free on-site parking will be provided.
- Holiday Toy Drive: Wish Upon A Toy is an organization created by Ryan Russek. In December 2003, Ryan's dad Ron was diagnosed with Renal Cell Carcinoma. In the following months his dad started aggressive treatments at the City of Hope Cancer Hospital. It was during those trips to the hospital with his dad that Ryan first encountered the pediatric patients battling cancer. The truth is that while many of these kids will win their battle with cancer, some will not, and for those kids this Christmas might be their last. It was with that realization that Ryan was inspired to make it the best Christmas he possibly could for the children of City of Hope. In 2006, Ryan reached out to his church and a local school for help and "Wish Upon a Toy" was born! The response was overwhelming and the "Wish Upon a Toy" was a tremendous success! Each year since then they have continued to grow to include drop off locations at local churches, restaurants, U.S. banks, Targets, and Carmax locations, plus an online donation campaign raising thousands of dollars throughout the years.

- Homeless Support: Operation Warm Wishes, or OWW, is dedicated to helping and serving the homeless, troubled youths, struggling families, Veterans and senior citizens in need throughout Orange County, CA and the world. Their mission is to inspire, motive and encourage those who are struggling to get back up. They collect food, clothing, shoes, and toiletries from our community and distribute to those in need daily. With Thanksgiving right around the corner, preparations are in place for Operation Warm Wishes' 8th Annual Unity in the Community Thanksgiving Spectacular. The free yearly event which runs from 12 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. on Thanksgiving Day at Peppertree Park at 230 W. First St. in Tustin is expected to draw participants and volunteers from across Southern California. The event features a FREE 3-course Thanksgiving dinner, with all the trimmings, for all members of the community.
- Literacy: Headquartered in Los Angeles, CA, non-profit Access Books refurbishes the libraries of California's most impoverished elementary school libraries in our cities' most underserved communities. Over the past 17 years, Access Books has served 247 schools in Los Angeles and surrounding areas and has donated nearly 1.4 million books. But many more schools remain on a waiting list. With 94% of funding going directly to programs "and aided by grants, sponsors and 10,000+ volunteers, including the students, parents and staff of the schools it serves" the average refurbishment costs approx. \$17,500 but is valued at more than triple that figure (approx. \$60,000). At least 90% of the children served by the non-profit live in poverty.
- Lung Cancer Awareness: The Bonnie J. Addario Lung Cancer Foundation (ALCF) is one of the largest philanthropies (patient-founded, patient-focused, and patient-driven) devoted exclusively to eradicating Lung Cancer through research, early detection, education, and treatment. The Foundation's goal is to work with a diverse group of physicians, organizations, industry partners, individuals, patients, survivors, and their families to identify solutions and make timely and meaningful change and turn lung cancer into a chronically managed disease by 2023. The ALCF was established on March 1, 2006 as a 501c(3) non-profit organization and has raised over \$30 million for lung cancer research and related programs.
- LUPUS AWARENESS: During her time at La Salle High School, Kat Sabido noticed something. Although there were many clubs on campus that fundraised for cancer and diabetes research, there were no clubs for lesser know, but equally devastating diseases. She decided to do something about that by form the Unbreakable Club to raise funds and awareness about Lupus. "Lupus is an incurable disease that has taken a toll on 5 million lives in this world and not even half the amount of that number is aware of what lupus is," said Kat. She continued, "My main motive for beginning this club was the fact that my older sister was diagnosed with lupus at the age of 16 and I have a first-hand experience of how damaging it can be to one's life." Kat and other members of La Salle High School's Unbreakable Club work to

spread awareness about lupus in any possible way, shape or form!

- MENTAL ILLNESS: La CLAVE is a mental health outreach campaign managed by the University of Southern California. Their goal is to help families living in San Fernando, Sylmar, Pacoima, Panorama City, North Hills and Sun Valley identify the signs of serious mental illness and promptly seek professional care. Each letter in the word CLAVE stands for a symptom that is associated with a serious mental illness. People should seek immediate help if they know anyone displaying any of the following symptoms: C False beliefs or delusions/Creencias falsas o ideas delirantes L Disorganized speech/Lenguaje desorganizado A Hallucinations/Alucinaciones Two examples of hallucinations are the following: V Seeing things that others do not see/Ver cosas que otros no ven E Hearing sounds or voices others do not hear/Escuchar sonidos o voces que otros no escuchan The La CLAVE campaign, implemented in Spanish and English, encourages people seeking help to visit www.UseLaClave.com or call the San Fernando Mental Health Center at 1-800-448-7097 for mental health services.
- MS AWARENESS: MuckFest MS is the FUN mud run with the best obstacles. No special training or equipment required: just bring a pair of sneakers and your sense of humor. The run is on a welldesigned 5K course, featuring awesome, super-sized obstacles and mud from start to finish. This event is built for laughs, but also on a serious mission to support people living with multiple sclerosis and to bring us closer to a world free of MS. 100% of fundraising dollars go to the National Multiple Sclerosis Society. The MS part of MuckFest MS stands for multiple sclerosis, an unpredictable, often disabling disease of the central nervous system, which interrupts the flow of information within the brain, and between the brain and body. Symptoms range from numbness and tingling to blindness and paralysis. The progress, severity and specific symptoms of MS in any one person cannot yet be predicted, but advances in research and treatment are moving us closer to a world free of MS. Most people with MS are diagnosed between the ages of 20 and 50, with at least two to three times more women than men being diagnosed with the disease. MS affects more than 2.3 million worldwide. This is the reason for MuckFest MS "to rally friends in support of people living with MS in our community. The SoCal MuckFest MS will take place Saturday, November 12, 2016 at Prado Regional Park!
- OVARIAN CANCER AWARENESS: Michael R. Manuel, MD, MPH, a leading expert in Gynecologic Oncology for Dignity Health- California Hospital Medical Center, came into the studio to talk about Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month. Ovarian cancer ranks fifth in cancer deaths among women, accounting for more deaths than any other cancer of the female reproductive system. A woman's risk of getting ovarian cancer during her lifetime is about 1 in 75. Her lifetime chance of dying from ovarian cancer is about 1 in 100.
- **PIT BULL RESCUE:** The mission of Angel City Pit Bulls is to create a better future for pit bulls by promoting their positive image as loving family companions through education, public advocacy,

adoptions and owner support. Founded in 2010, Angel City Pit Bulls was created to address the problem of overpopulation and high euthanasia rates of pit bull terrier type dogs in Los Angeles shelters. Since it's creation over 500 dogs placed in loving homes!

- Safe Driving: The Conor Lynch Foundation has been established to support new and existing programs that raise awareness about the dangers of distracted driving and promote the safety of runners, pedestrians, cyclists and young drivers. Distracted driving includes texting, eating, using your phone, changing your radio station or interacting with passengers while driving; anything that takes your eyes off the road, challenges your cognitive abilities and slows reaction times, is a distraction and a danger. All donations are used to ensure that no family suffers a loss like this again and as a community get closer to Super Safe Streets for everyone. The 6th Annual 5K Color Run/Walk/Expo In Honor of Conor Lynch who lost his life, at the age of 16, while crossing Woodman Ave. in Sherman Oaks while training for cross country on October 19, 2010, is a fundraiser to raise awareness and promote the safety of pedestrians, runners, cyclists, and young drivers. There will be awards given for each age group. This year the event will take place on October 23rd.
- SPECIAL EDUCATION FUNDRAISER: The annual SKECHERS Pier to Pier Friendship Walk is an awe-inspiring event that brings together all walks of life for one common purpose; to support children with special needs and education. The walk is produced by SKECHERS USA and co-produced by The Friendship Circle. On Sunday, October 23rd, the SKECHERS Pier to Pier Friendship Walk begins next to the Manhattan Beach Pier. Participants will walk south towards the Hermosa Beach Pier for the turnaround point, then return to the Manhattan Beach Pier.
- Support For Haiti: Urbana Chappa is a well known stylist and designer! After overcoming postpartum depression and multiple miscarriages, Urbana harnessed her energy into creating Maison de Mini, an eco-friendly, charity driven children's line made from allergy friendly bamboo. Bamboo is grown without pesticides and chemical fertilizers and is also a light, thermal regulating, anti-fungal fabric that holds a natural UV-protection. The fabric is not only beneficial for children, but also for the environment. The brand donates both clothing and profits to disadvantaged children via the Haitian America Caucus.
- Veteran Affairs: PAWS/LA is launching a new program called PROJECT PETSTRONG to help Veterans with PTSD keep and care for their companion animals. PAWS/LA has been helping low-income seniors and People Living with HIV/AIDS maintain their pets since the late 80s. PROJECT PETSTRONG is designed to ease the financial, physical and emotional challenges of caring for a companion animal, both in and outside of the home. Members of PROJECT PETSTRONG will gain access to a comprehensive package of essential animal support services "all at no charge" to eligible participants. PROJECT PETSTRONG is now enrolling low-income Veterans with PTSD who live in Los Angeles County. For more

- Voting: Eric Garcetti was raised in the San Fernando Valley and earned his B.A. and M.A. from Columbia University. He studied as a Rhodes Scholar at Oxford and the London School of Economics and taught at Occidental College and USC. A fourth generation Angeleno, he and his wife, Amy Elaine Wakeland, have a young daughter. He is a Lieutenant in the U.S. Navy reserve and is an avid jazz pianist and photographer. He was elected four times by his peers to serve as President of the Los Angeles City Council from 2006 to 2012. From 2001 until taking office as Mayor, he served as the Council member representing the 13th District which includes Hollywood, Echo Park, Silver Lake, and Atwater Village all of which were dramatically revitalized under Garcetti's leadership. On this weekend's show LA Mayor Eric Garcetti reminds us how important voting in the November 8th election truly is. He also gives his endorsement for Measure M and Proposition HHH!
- Women Empowerment: New Directions for Women (NDFW) was founded, in part, by Pamela Wilder in 1977, with the support and assistance of the Jr. League of Orange County. Pamela stood up in a Jr. League meeting, identified herself as a recovering alcoholic and asked for help and support in establishing a recovery program for women. Two other women, Marion Schoen and Muriel Zink, were also instrumental in New Direction's beginnings. A luxury treatment facility was created in response to a shortage of affordable and accessible rehabilitation treatment services for women suffering from alcoholism, substance abuse and other chemical dependency problems. For nearly 4 decades, NDFW has expanded to become an internationally recognized, comfortable, luxury, attractive 30-bed residential rehab located in Southern California. State licensed and certified, their award winning facility touts a very high recovery rate. They accept most insurances and have partial scholarship opportunities available for those who may lack some financial resources.
- YOUTH DEVELOPMENT: The First Tee of Orange County is more than a sports program for kids and teens" it shapes the lives of young people. The First Tee provides character-building and life-skills lessons through the game of golf which parallels life as players experience the highs and lows of the game. Their programs reinforce values like integrity, respect, responsibility and perseverance and promote healthy habits. In September 2013, The First Tee of Orange County began providing educational programs to youth, ages 4 to 18, at The Islands Golf Center in Anaheim. To date, more than 580 youth, representing seventeen cities and communities in Orange County have enrolled in their signature program " The First Tee Life Skills Experience. Programs are also offered at Dad Miller Golf Course and Anaheim Hills Golf Course in Anaheim and Shorecliffs Golf Club and San Clemente Municipal Golf Course in San Clemente. In addition, more than 3,000 children have been served in our afterschool, outreach program, DRIVE, in 12 elementary schools in Orange, Tustin and Santa Ana.

• Youth Mentorship: The mission of Youth Mentoring is to awaken atrisk youth to their power, unique gifts and purpose by matching them with caring adult mentors and placing that match within a structured group dynamic that provides the resources youth need to reach productive, conscious adulthood. Youth Mentoring seeks to awaken society to the needs, promise and value of this overlooked population. KIIS-FM and the Youth Mentoring have partnered up for the second Miles of Music 5K on Sunday, December 11, 2016 at CBS Radford Studios! Miles of Music 5k is an annual event that directly supports Youth Mentoring. The goal is to awaken at-risk youth to their power, unique gifts and purpose by matching them with caring adult mentors and placing that match within a structured group dynamic that provides the resources youth need to reach productive, conscious adulthood.
