KYSR provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- Animal Care: Peace 4 Animals non-profit animal welfare organization was founded by model/actress, philanthropist and filmmaker Katie Cleary in 2012. Peace 4 Animals has raised tens of thousands of dollars for many animal organizations around the globe in support of the protection of endangered species.
- Animal Care & Wellness: Social Compassion in Legislation (SCIL) is a 501c4 non-profit dedicated to animal welfare, rights and protection. The founder of SCIL is Judie Mancuso, who has a proven track-record, that spans decades, in sponsoring and supporting legislation promoting the care and protection of animals.
- Animal Rescue: All of their dogs are available for adoption in Los Angeles until they are transported to NYC where demand for small, apartment sized dogs is high. Unlike other bicoastal rescue groups, they are exclusively flying dogs in cabin with volunteer chaperones. They provide the carrier & reimburse the dog's ticket.
- Arts: Ali & Danielle from The Young Entertainer Awards Foundation is a non-profit organization that was created by various members of the entertainment industry who want to provide a positive incentive for young entertainers to perfect their skills, build a strong foundation of confidence that will benefit them, and even provides an annual scholarship to an individual or to another organization or institution assisting talented youth who might not otherwise be able to realize their dream. On Sunday, March 19th The Young Entertainer Awards Foundation will put on its' YEA Awards at Universal Studios' Globe Theatre. Our own Manny On The Streets will be hosting the event! Special awards will be given out to Up & Coming Music Producer of the Year, International Vocal Artist, the YEA Lifetime Achievement Award and the YEA Scholarship Winner.
- At-Risk Youth : as the National Runaway Switchboard, is the federallydesignated national communication system (hotline and website) for runaway, homeless and at-risk youth. NRS is the go-to resource for runaway and homeless youth and their families. (1-800-RUNAWAY), online (1800RUNAWAY.org), texting (HELP to 66008)

- Breast Cancer : Spoke with Dr. John West, Building upon his experience starting one of the first comprehensive breast cancer diagnostic and treatment centers in the US in the mid 1980's (Long Beach Memorial Breast Center), John Link, M.D. founded Breastlink in 1995. While there are different comprehensive models (physician-owned, academic or university, hospital based, etc.), their providers came to believe the best way to ensure optimal patient results was to have a free-standing, multi-disciplinary breast cancer practice. A local network of breastdedicated providers is able to offer patients the benefits of subspecialty medicine without the cost structure and legacy interests found in many hospitals and/or universities.
- Cancer Support: Mommy and Me Cancer Foundation offers support to young mothers. Their carefully designed programs fit the needs of mothers battling life-threatening cancer that also face the challenges of raising young children. Since 2013, MAMCF has served hundreds of lives providing financial support, back up daycare, peer to peer group support and more. Regardless of cancer diagnosis or stage, they can help you and your family. Join them Mother's Day Weekend on May 13, 2017 for the 5th Annual Mommy and Me Cancer Foundation 5k. The run kicks off with a symbolic release of white doves in the air. The race takes place at the beautiful Angel Stadium in Anaheim, a place so fitting for our legendary angels who will be remembered that day. They hope to raise awareness and money for MAMCF's young families facing cancer.

- **Disability Support:** Spoke with Marissa Hacker, Every month Fantastic Friends hosts a fun social event for their members with special needs and volunteers. Members are always paired with a 1:1 volunteer at each event, who help them interact with other Fantastic Friends and participate in the event 's activities. Events are always fun and creative, and provide a variety of social and learning experiences for those with special needs.
- Domestic Violence: Human Options began with three leaders " Vivian Clecak, LCSW, Director of the Orange County Department of Mental Health in South Orange County, Carolyn Churm, Chairman of the Mental Health Advisory Board, and Margaret Thoreau, Vice Chairman, taking the lead in learning about domestic violence in Orange County. In 1981 a fourth founder, Anne Wright, joined them. Stunned by the stories they heard from clients and the awareness that one in four women is a victim of domestic violence at some point in her life, they dedicated themselves to making a difference.
- Domestic Violence Prevention: Spoke with Margaret Bayston from Laura's House. The mission of Laura's House is to change the social beliefs, attitudes and the behaviors that perpetuate domestic violence while creating a safe space to empower individuals and families affected by abuse. For more than 20 years, Laura's House has served those whose lives have been affected by domestic violence. Over the past two decades, Laura's House has provided shelter and support services to more than 4,000 battered women and children and counseling, life skills education and legal assistance to nearly 50,000 people.
- Election: Guest Speaker Dean Logan from Los Angeles County Office. The city's upcoming March 7 primary election will be consolidated into the Los Angeles County election. The County Board of Supervisors approved a measure on Dec. 6 that called for a countywide election in order to place a county measure before voters asking for a quarter-cent salestax increase to fund the fight against homelessness. The consolidation means that the county will perform poll worker recruitment, polling place recruitment, election day operations, ballot recovery, and vote tallying for the city. Among the offices on the ballot for the city's portion of the election are Los Angeles mayor, city controller, oddnumbered City Council districts and several school board seats. The Secretary of State's Office will hold the public drawing to determine the order that the candidates' names will appear on the March ballot. The city will hold its own random alphabet drawing in February to determine the order for the May 16 general election, should a runoff be required.

- Empowerment : Mujeres de Maiz (women of the corn) was founded in 1997 as a grassroots, multimedia women's activist organization based in East Los Angeles, California. Mujeres de Maiz utilizes community partnerships, mainly those developed with local artists, performers, educators, and organizers in the creation and implementation of our programming.
- Equality: Hispanas Organized for Political Equality (HOPE) was founded in 1989 by a dynamic and politically influential group of Latina's representing the full spectrum of business, political, and social tenets. The Latina History Day Conference, for which Latina History Day in California was created, draws over 600 women to celebrate the historic accomplishments of Latinas and partakes in forums on corporate advancement, the state of public education, and financial empowerment. Scheduled annually on the second Friday of March, Latina History Day is the only conference in Los Angeles that is designed specifically to meet the needs of Latina professionals; offering her resources, skills development, and networking opportunities to advance her career. The HOPE Leadership Institute (HLI) is the first and only statewide leadership program specifically designed for professional Latinas in California. The goal is to train Latina's in vital leadership and advocacy skills, enabling them to create fundamental change within their local neighborhoods and across California. The HLI spans ten months, January through October, and includes five 3-4 day training sessions. Training sessions are intense, full day, and inclusive of academic seminars, personal assessments, group work, group presentations, lobbying and advocacy, field trips, networking receptions, and conference attendance. In between sessions, participants are assigned both individual and group research projects. The Latina History Day Conference will go down on March 10th.
- Health & Fitness: Students Run LA is to challenge at-risk secondary students to experience the benefits of goal-setting, character development, adult mentoring and improved health by providing them with a truly life-changing experience: The training for and completion of the Skechers Performance Los Angeles Marathon. These very sick children all share one wish "to be normal."
- Law Enforcement Support : Badge of Heart is a non-profit organization dedicated to making real, meaningful differences in our community. Our work is driven by a core group of Police Officers who realize the power to effect change that comes from their tireless efforts. On Sunday, April 30th Badge of Heart will host their 3rd Annual Car Show in Los Angeles.
