KYSR provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- 24 Hour Food Drive: Pasadena City College will host its 1st annual Million Meals Marathon in partnership with the Los Angeles Food Bank, and the Pasadena Humane Society. The food drive will take place on Saturday, November 23, 2013 at 11:00am to Sunday, November 24, 2013 at 11:00am.
