KYSR provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- Animal Care & Wellness: PAWS LA is dedicated to preserving the loving bond between people and their companion animals. They provide services to assist low-income seniors and people disabled by a life-threatening illness keep and care for their pets. The PAWS/LA Programs are designed to ease the financial, physical and emotional challenges of caring for a companion animal, both in and outside of the home. To that end, PAWS/LA provides a comprehensive package of essential animal support services " all at no charge " to eligible participants.
- Animal Rescue: Animal Rescue Foundation (ARF) core mission is the rescue of dogs and cats who have run out of time at public shelters, giving them a chance at life until a new home can be found. ARF couples this focus with innovative programs strengthening the human-animal bond for children, seniors, veterans, and people in disadvantaged circumstances. ARF allows people to experience the unconditional love and acceptance of dogs and cats to fulfill a mission of People Rescuing Animals.
- Animal Rights : The Animal Hope and Wellness Foundation is a non-profit organization focused solely on rescuing abused and neglected animals. They rescue them, provide full rehabilitation services, and then work to find them their fur-ever families. We Are LA Family Festival aims to celebrate and engage the children and families in Los Angeles in a day-long family friendly music festival. All net proceeds will be distributed by the Los Angeles Galaxy Foundation in support of organizations in Los Angeles investing in the lives of children and families and making a difference in our community. Benefitting charities include: 826LA, Amer-I- Can, CASA of Los Angeles, Happy Trails for Kids, Junior Achievement of Southern California, and

Richstone Family Center. The day kicks off at 11 am and runs through 6 p.m. with family friendly activities. Families will also be able to enjoy interactive activities, including a songwriting booth, guitar lessons, jam sessions, arts & crafts, and food from the top food trucks across LA.

- Autism Support: The HollyRod foundation is dedicated to providing compassionate care to those living with autism and Parkinson's disease. They seek to fill an unmet need by providing compassionate care and services to underserved individuals and families that are burdened financially and emotionally by a diagnosis. Holly Robinson Peete is the founder of The HollyRod Foundation. Holly's father, Matthew T. Robinson, Jr., was the original Gordon on Sesame Street. Matt was diagnosed with PD in 1982 at the young age of 46. In honor of Holly's father, HollyRod partnered with the Center for Parkinson's Research and Movement Disorders at the Keck School of Medicine of the University of Southern California to establish the HollyRod Compassionate Care Program with the mission to improve the quality of life of people with Parkinson's who have little or no health insurance and limited financial resources.
- Brain Injury Awareness: Brain Injury Association of California (BIACAL) is a non-profit organization that promotes awareness of brain injury on a state, regional and local level; provides education and training to individuals with brain injury, to family members and professionals; delivers timely and accurate information and access to resources through the BIACAL website, help line and newsletters; and promotes progressive public policy while carrying out community and legislative advocacy. BIACAL does not receive any federal or state funding so it solely relies on donations, membership dues, sponsorships and proceeds from fundraising events to carry out its extensive programs and services. BIACAL is hosting its 9th Annual Walk for Brain Injury (Los Angeles) on Saturday September 10th at Santa Anita Park (infield). Actor/Comedian Larry Miller will emcee the event to include food trucks, live music, entertainment and an opportunity drawing. Children will be entertained with carnival games and a playground.

Medication can also affect the body's ability to stay hydrated and dissipate heat, sugary drinks can cause you to lose more body fluid. These are all things we need to keep in mind but may not think about.
