KYSR provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **Animal Adoption/Rescue:** Much Love Animal Rescue exists to rescue abused, neglected and homeless animals from the streets and shelters of Los Angeles and place them in loving homes. Much Love is a 100% non-profit organization run entirely by dedicated volunteers who offer their time and resources to house, train, transport, and care for these animals. Since its inception in 1999, Much Love has placed over 3,500 animals into loving homes.
- **Animal Care :** Peluches is dedicated to helping animals everywhere. Founder Chris Pouy's own rescue pup, acts as the inspiration and namesake behind the brand. Chris explains Peluche suffered from separation anxiety and depression while stuck in the shelter. Realizing not every pup has someone to play with was heartbreaking, which is why for each Peluche sold we donate one to an animal shelter. A friend in need is a friend indeed.
- **Arts:** Latinas Arts Foundation is a non-profit organization that was created to support arts education. It encourages the study, appreciation and recognition of excellence in Latin Arts. The foundation supports selected programs, programs of scholarship, research, conservation and exhibitions with institution and other non-profit organization that through Latin Arts is consistent with this mission. The Latinas Arts Foundation is a unique education institution dedicated to appreciate of the Latino Fine Arts and Culture. Our goals are to empower women and young girls, as well as to provide Education and Exposure to the Latino Arts Culture
- **Breast Cancer Awareness:** The Avon 39 Walk To End Breast Cancer is happening September 9th and 10th in Santa Barbara. Over two days, AVON 39ers walk 39.3 miles. Each walker also fundraises a minimum of \$1,800 which is funneled by the Avon Breast Cancer Crusade to local and national organizations that help women and men, regardless of their ability to pay, get the breast cancer health care they need. These programs provide everything from language, food, and transportation assistance, to financial help, and rely on the funds raised by AVON 39ers to keep making an incredible impact around the country.
- **Bullying:** SPEAK OUT AGAIN BULLYING: Speak Out Against Bullying Inc. advocates for social and civic changes to inspire a call to action

against bullying, cyber bullying and sexting through public awareness and education, providing resources to the community at large.

- **Cancer Awareness:** Padres Pedal the Cause: California non-profit public benefit corporation established to fund, plan and manage an annual two-day cycling fundraiser in partnership with the San Diego Padres. The organization's mission is to end cancer by raising money for innovative life-saving research in San Diego.
- **Child Support Services:** Starlight Children's Foundation: Starlight brings joy and comfort to hospitalized children and their families. Every 30 seconds, a child is diagnosed with a life-threatening medical condition. These children are often scared, confused, lonely and facing serious medical treatments. That's where Starlight comes in. Starlight programs turn a child's pain, fear and stress into laughter, fun, and joy by providing seriously ill children the best in entertainment, education and one-of-a-kind experiences " because sick kids are still kids.
- **Children's Health & Education:** After summer months of staying up late, zoning out in front of the TV or video screen, running wild outside, and eating snacks throughout the day, kids are in for a big adjustment as they head back to school. Most children need help transitioning back into a routine with deadlines for a successful start to the school year. It's also a good time for kids to visit the pediatrician to make sure their health makes the grade!
