Authorities are investigating a car crash in Westmoreland County. A car crashed late Friday night on Route 136 in Rostraver Township, then reportedly burst into flames.

Washington & Jefferson College police officers are going to start carrying handguns and wearing body cameras. Officials announced the move Friday and say implementation procedures are underway. The school says the decision enables the officers to provide higher levels of protection and more effective response to threatening situations.

Changes are being made to the rules for jury duty. Governor Tom Wolf signed a bill into law on Friday which will allow breastfeeding mothers and people over the age of 74 to opt out of serving on Pennsylvania juries. Federal and state judges will now also be automatically excluded.

Police are investigating a fatal shooting in North Union Township. Witnesses say a large fight broke out inside the Double Vision Bar and Grille early Saturday. The dispute reportedly moved outside, which is when Billy James was shot and killed. The shooter has not been located.

Two men are most likely going to serve house arrest after pleading guilty in a pain medication scheme. Randell Rice Junior and Carl Santavicca entered the pleas Friday and will also be required to testify against the other defendants. Officials say the men were both patients of Dr. William Ainsley, a Uniontown podiatrist who allegedly prescribed thousands of painkillers for patients and then got some back in return.

A man is facing charges following a dispute at the Veterans of Foreign Wars post in Greensburg. Witnesses say Chris Coleman got into an argument with a man at the East Pittsburgh Street facility last week. Coleman had to be restrained by customers until officers arrived. Officials say he is also accused of stealing the Greensburg fire chief's portable radio to broadcast a drunken tirade over the emergency airwaves in September.

A Scottdale man is awaiting sentencing after pleading guilty to causing an accident that killed one of his friends. Evan Yuhouse was driving on Route 982 in Bullskin in April when he lost control on a curve and hit a sign. Yuhouse fled the scene, leaving his three injured passengers behind. William Romesburg Jr. died the next day. The group was reportedly drinking at the Hide Out bar before the crash. Yuhouse faces up to 37-years behind bars following the Friday plea.

It is Election Day 2015. Polls will be open throughout Pennsylvania from seven o'clock this morning until eight o'clock tonight. Any voter trying to find their polling place can use the Department of State's Polling Place Search.

Police are asking for the public's help with a homicide investigation in North Union Township. Billy James was fatally shot at the Double Vision Bar and Grille over the weekend after a bar fight moved into the parking lot. Officers say about ten people were involved in the fight, but claim no one will talk for fear of retaliation. About six "persons of interest" have been questioned, but no arrests have been made.

A Brownsville man is facing charges for allegedly assaulting his girlfriend. She was at her house with Anthony Cronin Sunday, and was arguing with him because she wanted to leave. Cronin allegedly blocked the door and assaulted her, leaving her unconscious for an hour. The victim told police when she woke up that Cronin was begging her not to leave him. He is also accused of slamming her face into the steering wheel of her car and threatening to kill her.

Officials are confirming that a missing Donora man is dead. Chris Megela's body washed up Sunday along the Monongahela River shore on the Rostraver side. Megela was reported missing on October 14th.

Officials are investigating a potential threat that caused a lockdown at Bentworth High School. The threat was reportedly found in a bathroom yesterday morning and Bentleyville police were called to the scene. The building was searched but nothing suspicious was found. Officers stayed on the property until noon.

Democrats are reclaiming the majority on the Westmoreland County Board of Commissioners. Newcomer Democrat Gina Cerilli was elected last night along with Democratic incumbent Ted Kopas and Republican incumbent Charles Anderson. Tyler Courtney finished fourth.

Jonathan Held is getting another term as Westmoreland County Sheriff. Held beat out Democratic challenger Paul Cycak with about 53-percent of the vote. Cycak is the chief deputy coroner.

Three Democrats are victorious in the race for the state Supreme Court. Christine Donohue, Kevin Dougherty, and David Wecht all beat their challengers yesterday, giving Democrats a majority on the high court for at least a decade. Officials say this was the most expensive U.S. Supreme Court race in history with more than 15-point-eight million dollars spent.

A new government-backed retirement savings program starts today. The free, low-risk financial account is called MyRA. It's designed for lower- and middle-income Americans who don't have access to a 401(k) plan at work.

Greene County commissioners are looking strangely familiar. Voters returned incumbents Blair Zimmerman and Archie Trader to the board yesterday. They also elected former county commissioner Dave Coder.

California University of Pennsylvania is mourning the loss of a student. Twenty-one-year-old Mason Reiff was killed in a crash Monday night on Route 88 in California. Reiff and three other people were ejected from the vehicle. Officials have not revealed what caused the accident.

A Westmoreland County man is facing animal cruelty charges after allegedly kicking a dog. Zachary Gannon is accused of kicking an eight-month-old boxer in the back leg at a home on Newark Street in Hempfield Township last month. He reportedly kicked the dog so hard the dog had to have the leg amputated.

An Albert Gallatin High School senior is recovering following a traffic accident in Smithfield Township. Eighteen-year-old Kayla Darst is in stable condition after being flown from the scene by a medical helicopter Tuesday. Police say her vehicle hit a tree on Main Street.

More information is being released about the shooting death of a man in North Union. An autopsy has revealed Billy James was shot three times in the chest, and died from internal bleeding. James was reportedly shot last weekend during a fight at the Double Vision Bar and Grill on Oliver Road.

A Uniontown man is awaiting sentencing after being convicted of fatally stabbing a woman outside a bar in Fairchance. The jury found Darius Samuel guilty of third-degree murder yesterday after a three-day trial, during which Samuel refused to testify in his own defense. Prosecutors say he stabbed Rashaunda Fitzgerald outside the Goal Post Lounge in 2014.

Four people are recovering from stab wounds after being attacked on the University of California at Merced [[mur-SED]] campus. Two of the stabbing victims were students, one was a staff member and the fourth person was a contract worker on campus

A Fayette County prison guard is facing charges for allegedly beating an inmate. Robert Michael, Jr. was caught on surveillance video punching the inmate and knocking him down while he was handcuffed and shackled. Michael was charged Monday with assault and reckless endangerment.

Joseph Lane was charged with harassment and assault for the incident, which allegedly occurred last month when an argument with the victim turned physical. Lane is accused of throwing the woman to the ground and causing minor injuries.

Two Uniontown men are facing charges for what police are calling a "large scale cocaine trafficking business." Semori Wilson and Nygel Saunders were arrested last week after a search of Saunders' home turned up more than a kilogram of cocaine and crack cocaine.

A Uniontown man is facing charges for allegedly trying to run over a woman with a truck. Police say Richard Schoch got into an argument with the victim while she was driving in Wharton Township over the weekend with her four-year-old son in the vehicle. The victim told police she pulled over near the Marathon gas station, and Schoch began punching her in the face. When she jumped out, Schoch allegedly drove the vehicle directly at her. The woman ran to the gas station and called police.

Brownsville officials are working on a plan to build a memorial for area military personnel who have been killed in action since World War One. A committee has been established to get all the names, which will then go on an honor roll at Snowden Square in downtown Brownsville.

A teenager is dead following an accident in Brownsville. Eighteen-year-old Andre Smith was involved in a criminal incident early yesterday and when officers responded, he took off. He was reportedly attempting to make a turn when he lost control and hit a building. He was pronounced dead a short time later.

A live bullet is being blamed for a lockdown at Hempfield Middle School. A teacher found the bullet Friday afternoon in the hallway and police were called in to search the building. No other ammunition was found nor were any weapons.

Governor Tom Wolf says progress is being made on the state budget. Wolf announced yesterday that he has reached an agreement with Republicans for a 750-million-dollar increase in education funding. The increase would take place over two years and is the largest education funding increase in state history. A spokeswoman for Senate Majority Leader Jake Corman says Republicans are feeling positive, but the details are still being worked out.

A man is facing charges following a confrontation in Fairchance. Kevin Lake allegedly ran over Justin Detrick in the parking lot of the American Legion early Saturday. Witnesses say Lake purposely accelerated his car toward Detrick, hitting him in the legs. He is also accused of punching a woman in the face earlier in the evening at a home in Georges Township.

A group of homeowners in Dunbar are going to resume their Neighborhood Crime Watch program. The spokesman asked borough council for permission Monday night and Mayor Norm Gordon says he supports the program and will discuss it with the police department. The group wants to use walkie-talkies and a vehicle is being donated for patrols.

A fire is being blamed for an evacuation at Nemacolin Woodlands Resort. The flames broke out late Saturday night in the chimney at the original lodge building. No structural damage was reported and guests were allowed back in a short time later.

Republican Guy Reschenthaler's state Senate swearing-in ceremony is being postponed. Reschenthaler won the special election for the 37th District and was supposed to make it official on Wednesday but four challenged election ballots are holding things up. The four ballots won't change the outcome of the Senate race, but the Washington County Board of Elections can't give a final vote count until candidates have a chance to challenge provisional ballots that were tossed out

A Masontown man is going to prison for an armed robbery. John Bendishaw pleaded guilty to robbing the victim at gunpoint and was sentenced to three-to-six-years yesterday. Police say Bendishaw approached the victim with a gun in May and threatened to shoot him if he didn't hand over drugs or money.

Police are investigating an accident that killed one person and injured two others in Dunbar Township. Witnesses say two cars collided yesterday on West Crawford Avenue near West Crawford Elementary School. Richard O'Nell, a passenger in one of the vehicles, was pronounced dead at the scene. The driver of that car was airlifted to the hospital with serious injuries.

A Donora police officer is recovering after being bitten by a pit bull during an arrest. Joshua Rose was wanted on a warrant and officials received a tip that he was at his girlfriend's home Sunday. No one answered the door so police forced entry and found Jade Hewitt hiding under a blanket with the pit bull.

A vote on medical marijuana is scheduled for next week. Officials announced yesterday that the House will take up the bill on Monday. The measure would allow doctors to prescribe the drug for a short list of approved medical conditions. Governor Tom Wolf has previously said he will sign the bill into law.

A prison guard is recovering after being assaulted at the State Correctional Institution at Greene. The facility went on lockdown yesterday after the attack in a general population housing unit. The guard was taken to the hospital and was treated and released. The inmate is already serving a life sentence.

State police say Hanlan jumped a fence and managed to escape. Hanlan's sister, Vanessa Hanlan, is accused of helping him get away. Hanlan has since been returned to the Greene County facility he escaped from.

The attorney general of Pennsylvania is now being investigated by the state's Ethics Commission. AG Kathleen Kane was targeted by the group after a self-proclaimed "government watchdog" reported a complaint. Kane is already facing charges and is in danger of being removed from office.

Governor Tom Wolf says he's vetoing parts of a state budget. It was passed by the Republican-controlled Legislature just before Christmas. Democrat Wolf calls it "garbage" and says lawmakers should get back to work. The governor says he will release emergency funds to keep schools from closing. Pennsylvania has been without a state budget since July 1st.

A father and son are facing charges in Westmoreland County for allegedly selling heroin.
