Friday featured Hotel Barron George Flavius Titlow and grandson of Henry Beeson one of Uniontown's founders. George Titlow built a hotel in 1892 that became the destination for prestigious coal coke and steel barons of the area but sold the Tavern with the start of Prohibition. But the Tavern remains a landmark today and has been restored to its original grandeur and is like walking into a museum. George Titlow was also responsible for early tourism in Fayette County with the Summit Mountain Hill Climb Races. It's success paved the way for the Uniontown speedway in Hopwood which drew world famous drivers from 1916 to 1922 drawing film-stars, entrepreneurs like Henry Ford Thomas Edison and more
