A Washington County man is set to die by lethal injection next month. Governor Tom Corbett yesterday signed an execution warrant for 36-year-old Patrick Stollar. The execution is scheduled for August 20th.

University of Pittsburgh Medical Center workers are no longer allowed to use tobacco products during their shifts. The new policy barring tobacco use took effect today, but plans for it were announced a year ago.
