WCVF contains numerous programs that cater to community issues. They include:

- NPR (National Public Radio)
 - Which is carried daily from 7-9am (“Morning Edition”) and 4-6pm (“All Things Considered”) Monday through Friday. NPR covers everything from international and national news to interviews and special topics. NPR covers any current event that may have an effect on our daily lives.
- High Noon Friday
 - A completely student-produced live talk/variety show that airs every Friday at noon. It is one hour long and features a variety of segments such as comedy skits, news, sports, reviews, interviews with campus and community members, trivia show, and more!
- Local Lo-Down
 - Every Wednesday 7-8pm WCVF airs “Local Lowdown”. It is a live showcase of strictly local artists and performers with an emphasis on promoting upcoming events/concerts in the local community.
- Sabor Latino
 - A community member show ran by Harry Echevarria and his co-hosts. They feature music for the local spanish community throughout their 2 hours time block from 6-8pm on Saturdays.
- WCVF also carries Fredonia State sporting events, specifically hockey. Games are typically Friday and Saturday nights at 7pm but also occasionally land at other times. We also cover baseball, basketball and soccer.

- When DJ's are live on the air, we require that they announce one grapevine file per hour. Grapevines are non-profit announcements about community events. They are time-sensitive and are either announced manually by the djs.
