The transmission appears to have been from contact with a known case at an out-of-county workplace. There is no evidence of community spread, at this point. The patient is currently doing well, following appropriate precautions, and is isolated. Public Health Nursing is communicating with the patient, and helping the person to safely follow the home isolation protocol. Contact Tracing is underway.
