Section I. Issues

The station has identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. **Animal Neglect and Abuse:** Over the past year many hoarding and animal neglect cases have come to light in the Hudson Valley. Some cases lead to legal action and criminal charges. These cases have put addition stress on many local animal rescues.
- B. **Increase Veteran Spending:** The Hudson Valley is home to many Veterans' and their Families. With more veteran's living in the area there is an increase need for more support for them. And there is also a need for increased awareness of existing services.
- C. **Food Insecurity:** This topic has become a focus in the Hudson Valley due to economic changes that now have schools and organizations seeing that the face of food insecurity is changing for our county area in New York. The traditional model for monitoring who maybe food insecure has changed.
- D. **Charity Funding:** We recognized that there were a number of organizations that were running short on funding during the last few months of 2019. Local news stories covered shortages and a call to action for the public to donate time and money.
- E. **Ecotourism Safety**: Over the past year there have been numerous injuries, even death, at some of the Hudson Valley's best-known Ecotourism destinations. The need for trail awareness and outdoor preparedness is growing.
