The station has identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. **Environment.** The Hudson River Estuary Program helps people enjoy, protect, and revitalize the Hudson River and its valley. The Program has drastically improved water quality in the Hudson River.
- B. **Health.** Health officials warn this year's flu virus is the same that once killed over 50 million people. Nine states, including New York, are experiencing high influenza activity. Flu cases in New York alone are up by 72%.
