So far this year there has been 135. Also, this year Fentanyl makes up 40% of those cases compared to only 1% in 2015. Health experts think the main culprit is that people think they are buying regular prescription drugs off the street, but many end up being laced with Fentanyl. While it works much like morphine, it is 50-100 times stronger.

However, the data doesn't yet back up concerns, some districts are adjusting grading policies. Others may begin implementing small in-person learning sessions for students to help to bridge the gap. Districts will have more data in January.
