Thank you for Fox and MyTV promotions for The Arc's Lights on St Paul 2013! Your sponsorship was highlighted nightly as visitors drove through our glowing and dancing 1.3 million lights! Despite a shorter season between Thanksgiving and Christmas and some challenging weather, the support from the community was overwhelming. We closed the 32 nights of the exhibit on December 29th with:

- 18,605 vehicles (cars, party buses, trolleys, and limos)
- \$71,000 bucket donations
- \$8,600 "Shine" donations
- 570 volunteers giving 6,350 hours to build displays, set up and take down displays, & help during the event)

Over the years The Arc's Lights on St Paul has grown into a community tradition and major fundraiser that supports The Arc's services and programs for individuals and families living with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

The funds raised help us provide more than 600 programs to 3,700 individuals at no or low cost all year long. As a result, more youth are able to participate in fun safe activities at The Arc during school in-service days and Christmas and Spring Breaks, while families receive valuable respite. More scholarships are available for students to attend YESS. Supportive mentoring relationships continue to develop through Circle of Friends and Cornerstone, changing the lives of participants and those around them. More adults are able to benefit from fun social activities that brighten their daily routines, including lunch bunch, monthly dances and art days, as well as trips that create memories that last a lifetime.

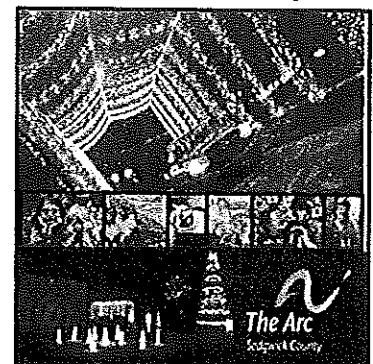

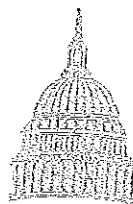
