News Report of Stories Covering Critical Needs

In the first quarter of 2015, FOX 2 covered a broad range of stories of compelling interest to our viewers -- well told, smartly executed and skillfully displayed -- containing the human element that people are interested in. FOX 2 opened 2015 in much the same manner as 2014 went out, with stories covering government operations, heartbreaking crime and violence, but also the enduring spirit and resilience of Metro Detroiters.

Amid the difficult and troubling topics we must confront, it is heartening to receive a note like this to reporter-anchor Amy Andrews:

"Hi Amy, You have us in tears here at CWHL. That segment with Mikayla Marcero was absolutely beautiful. We've had many interviews over the past years, but your interview was so inspiring and every fact was spot on. I'm sure this will inspire many more children dealing with hair loss or even kids being bullied for other reasons and give them hope! We continue to be an agent of positive change, uncovering injustices and fighting through bureaucracy to improve the lives of metro Detroit citizens regardless of their position or influence. We carefully track the stories that help stitch us together as a community through the shared experience of witnessing them unfold. Our efforts are not done for accolades, but out of a sense of responsibility. We can and do make a difference in our community.

## **PROBLEM SOLVERS**

Ultracold, team. Multiple stories. We shivered through the second coldest February on record ... the coldest was in 1875 ... and worked to equip our viewers and users with strategies in coping with the ultracold (car care, health, pets, plumbing, insulation, fire prevention) in addition to the covering the many angles presented by the frigid conditions (among them water main breaks, firefighting issues, travel and commuting, neglect of animals, the elderly and the homeless). Just for good measure, we endured a historic snowfall – one storm, 16 inches – and served our viewers with an early 4am start to our shows, extensive live and on-line coverage and updating, and many heroics in helping one another get to work.

Stolen show dogs, David Spencer. Multiple stories. Spencer's attention to the weekend theft of an Illinois woman's van from a motel in Ann Arbor ... with three show dogs inside ... resulted in our viewers launching a search for them and miraculously locating them all running loose ... plus the van ... in Detroit.

Hero pit bull, Erika Erickson. Multiple stories. Erickson combined with our web team for a series of stories in March that drew wide attention, about a pit bull that protected a woman from her abusive boyfriend, only to be taken away for euthanizing because her suburb bans the breed. Her work packed a public meeting, generated a groundswell of protest on social media and ultimately saved the dog's life.

## **HEALTH AND WELLNESS**

Weight Loss Winners, Deena Centofanti. On Fridays on January, Centofanti focuses on inspiring stories of local people losing weight. They include a young Ann Arbor man who was an obese kid and is now a personal trainer, a couple that lost a combined 380 pounds, and a Southfield woman who embarked on a dramatic weight loss journey that is visually stunning.

MS awareness, Deena Centofanti. March 3. Centofanti convenes a panel of experts from the Wayne State University of Medicine and the Detroit Medical Center to discuss Multiple Sclerosis. MS impacts more than 2 million people worldwide and more than 18,000 in Michigan, including members of the FOX 2 staff. MS is an unpredictable disease of the central nervous system that disrupts the flow of information within the brain, and between the brain and body. Greater awareness encourages understanding and generates support in the search for treatment and cure.

Children with Hair Loss, Amy Andrews. Feb. 25, 3:00. When Mikayla Marcero was 7 years old, her doctor diagnosed her with Alopecia Areata, a skin disorder affecting more than 6.6 million people in the United States. Mikayla, who was in second grade and became completely bald, went from worrying about what kind of snack her mom was going to pack for lunch to what the bullies were going to do to her at school. But then, something wonderful happened. Mikayla was introduced to the founder of Children with Hair Loss, a local nonprofit providing human hair replacements to children at no cost. A wig from Children with Hair Loss had such a profound effect on Mikayla, she was able to regain her confidence and get through those tough years in school when kids are often judged by their appearance. The 21-year-old is now the ambassador for Children with Hair Loss and helps countless other kids dealing with the devastating problem.

## **GOVERNMENTAL AFFAIRS**

Fix the roads, Charlie Langton. March 23, 3:30. The aggressive battle over how to pay the billion-dollar bill to repair Michigan's crumbling and dangerous roads took a dramatic turn with reporter Charlie Langton's story on a possible Plan B ... tapping a seemingly overfinanced \$18 billion insurance fund meant to cover catastrophic injuries. This comes as a ballot proposal to raise the state's sales tax to seven percent faces wide opposition.

New county executive, Roop Raj. Jan. 5, 3:00. Warren Evans takes over as Wayne County executive after his election win in November, facing a gigantic deficit and the very real possibility of the county following the city of Detroit into bankruptcy. Raj takes a look at the challenges ahead.

State speed limits, Tim Skubick. March 26, 2:30. Once thought to be dead, there's a renewed effort at the Michigan state capitol to hike some freeway speeds to 80 miles an hour. The increases would likely occur in rural areas as opposed to more crowded urban highways, but opponents fear the change would lead to speeds in excess of 80 and highways that are much more dangerous.

## **INVESTIGATIVE REPORTING**

Power pastor, Rob Wolchek. March 18, 6:00. Wolchek exposes a Detroit pastor's scheme to offer to collect a one-time fee to settle back heating bills, a promise that was proven to be fictitious. The pastor fled after our story hit air, likely saving many people from giving him money they couldn't afford to lose.

IRS scammers, Rob Wolchek. Jan. 14, 5:00. Wolchek details a shameful scam carried out by crooks pretending to be IRS agents calling unsuspecting metro Detroiters demanding immediate payment and threatening arrest if the money is not paid. His story included an entertaining telephone exchange with the scammers themselves, and served as warning that gained attention across the nation.

Detroit city council, M.L. Elrick. Multiple stories. Elrick's work delves deeper than any news organization in the market with a detailed look at the backgrounds of candidates to fill an empty council seat, uncovering multiple foreclosures, bankruptcies and in one case, violent felonies. He reported exclusively that the chairman of the panel considering the raise for council had a potential conflict of interest ... he is a lobbyist who does business with politicians like city council members. He also chronicled the drunken driving case of councilman Scott Benson, including exclusive police video of the arrest and audio of the lawmaker's incoherent dialogue. His keen eye also brought our viewers the news that city council gave itself an extra week of vacation while coming under criticism for seeking a pay raise at the same time city pensioners received benefit cuts.

## **CRIME AND LAW ENFORCEMENT**

Federal Judge shot, team. Multiple reports. U.S. District Judge Terrence Berg told reporter Taryn Asher he did not want his experience as a crime victim outside his Detroit home to define the city ... but despite the many positives seen in beleaguered Motown in March 2015, violence and horrifying crime continued to cast a shadow over a city on the comeback. Judge Berg's ordeal

began the evening of March 5 when two men approached him as he retrieved a garbage can from the curb. Two men confronted him and he was shot when he refused to let them into his home. The story broke in our late newscasts and we have followed the manhunt ... so far unsuccessful ... the judge's medical treatment and ultimately the judge's one-on-one interview with Asher.

Seven-year-old killed, team. Multiple reports. The controversial case of Detroit Police officer Joseph Weekley came to a close in January when the county prosecutor declined to try him a third time for shooting a seven-year-old during a raid. Two earlier tries ended in mistrials. A element in the case is the fact that his team was trailed by a reality show crew, bringing accusations that the police were showboating for the cameras.

Bashara murder trial, Amy Lange. Multiple reports. The case of Grosse Pointe Park businessman Bob Bashara, convicted of murdering of his wife Jane, concluded with Jane's relatives tearing into him at his January sentencing after a trial that exposed Bashara's extramarital affairs, mistresses, lies to family, sado-masochistic lifestyle, secret sex dungeon and attempts to trick friends into providing alibis. He received life in prison without parole and declined to take any responsibility for his actions.

Children in freezer, team. Multiple reports. Emotional shockwaves rolled across the city after a bailiff evicting a mother of four discovered the ultimate horror ... two of the woman's children dead in a freezer. The case generated a series of daily stories, discussion of motive and an examination of how the children could have been dead for more than a year without neighbors, relatives or school officials raising the alarm.

## **THE AMERICANS**

Walking man, Charlie LeDuff. Feb. 11, 6:00. Three reporters collaborated on the Walking Man story, a humble Detroiters who walked 20 miles to and from work. The story gained international attention and yielded a groundswell of financial support and a donated car, but was pushed to a new level by reporter Charlie LeDuff. LeDuff's police contacts told him the man's new-found fortune was putting him in danger from hustlers and criminals wanting a piece of the pie, and LeDuff helped out and went along as James Robertson was moved to a safer location.

Alabama civil rights, Charlie LeDuff. Feb. 26, 6:00. Charlie LeDuff traveled to Alabama as part of his "The Americans" franchise to examine the historical roots of "Bloody Sunday," the landmark civil rights event approaching its 50th anniversary, and examines the people who are immortalized in the "police dog" photos that shocked the nation.

Coach Harbaugh, Charlie LeDuff. March 23, 6:00. Charlie LeDuff, working his franchise "The Americans," generated a national news buzz with his examination of the big-money world of college athletics when new University of Michigan football coach Jim Harbaugh acknowledged he was not worth his \$5 million annual salary.

Ag summit, Charlie LeDuff. March 12, 6:00. LeDuff travels to Iowa for the Ag Summit of Republican presidential hopefuls, tossing questions at all of those present ... and getting answers ... while laying the groundwork for further interactions on the campaign trail.

## **FRANCHISES**

**Job shop, Murray Feldman.** A daily, 30-second description of a job opening somewhere in the metro Detroit area, plus tips on how to get hired.

**Tech talk, Derek Kevra.** A weekly franchise that looks at popular new technology and gadgets, helping to explain how they work and why they are revolutionary. The franchise highlights not just large-scale national releases, but also local tech companies and startups. Additionally, the weekly segment addresses topical technology questions on a local scale.

**Let It Rip, every Thursday at 10:30pm and Sunday at 9:30am.** Huel Perkins, Charlie Langton and Taryn Asher host a 30-minute examination of news-based topics driving community opinion and discussion. We invite guests involved with the stories to come to the station as panelists and drill deeply into complex subjects, pushing past episodic coverage. Topics included consenting teens on sex offender list, more women seeking concealed weapons permits, free-range parenting, Ben Carson's presidential chances, the state of the city with Detroit Police Chief James Craig, the Uber ride service, ticket scalping legislation, how to fix the state's crumbling roads, a hero pitbull on death row, the deaths of two children found in a freezer, the case of a woman forced to remove her hijab after being arrested on a traffic warrant, the terror attacks in Paris, prosecution of a man who shot another at a gas station while dressed as Santa, the future of Detroit schools, gay marriage and the role of a metro Detroit couple in a case before the U.S. Supreme Court, medical marijuana, a videotaped beating by police of a carjacking suspect, the case of a doctor who denied care to a gay couple's newborn, the legality of threats on Facebook, mandatory vaccinations, civics tests for high school seniors, pothole insurance problems, what should happen to Brian Williams, 50 Shades of Grey, plus-size models, Detroit preachers on reality television, Empire show depictions of race, daylight saving time, mandatory voting, transgender people at gyms and religious freedom laws.
