Douglas Broadcasting's radio stations are involved in their communities. Management and staff regularly attempt to ascertain the most pressing issues and needs of the community, and then to present programming which addresses those issues and needs. The following list shows some of the significant issues responded to by station programming, along with examples of programming aired in response to those issues during the quarter noted. The listing is by no means exhaustive, and the order in which the issues appear does not reflect any priority or significance.

ISSUE: Environment – Settler Wind Farm

PROGRAM: KKTS News

DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAM OR SEGMENT: KKTS News reported on the announcement of construction of the new Settler Wind Farm south of Glenrock. The project will generate enough green, renewable energy to power the equivalent of 44 thousand homes.
