Wisconsin Farms Oral History Project airs every Sunday from 11am-Noon during the academic year. The final show was May 6th. It is produced by the UW-Whitewater Public History Department and focuses on the history of food and farming in Wisconsin, in particular as those relate to race, ethnicity, and cultural diversity. The project employs a “community-based history” approach, primarily through oral history collection and story sharing. It also includes the collection of documents and artifacts and the aggregation of scholarly, historical and other content and resources on topics related to farming, race and ethnicity.

WSUW also produces a five-minute newscasts each weekday that air at 8am, 10am and 4pm and focus on local, state and national developments. WSUW also airs a variety of Public Service Announcements that originate locally, regionally and on the national level.

From May 31st until June 30th in this period, WSUW was off-the-air due to summer recess.
