

Annual EEO Public File Report

TYPE OF RECRUITMENT INITIATIVE MENU SELECTION	BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF ACTIVITY
1 Internship Program	During the reporting period, WJFW hosted one winter internship and two summer internships. The Interns earn college credit while they are at the station. The interns were encouraged to participate in the day to day activities in the news department. The interns were also given the opportunity to work in the production department as well. These students were also encouraged to ask questions and were allowed to do reporting on their own. These student interns were under the supervision of the News Director.
2. Station Tours	During the reporting period, WJFW hosted station tours. WJFW always welcomes the public to tour the station WJFW conducts news and weather tours to many different groups. October 2014 ,the Rhinelander Girl Scout troop 7091 came for a tour and a live viewing of the 5pm newscast. April 21st 2015- The station hosted a tour of 13 students from the Merrill High School. They toured the station , and spend most of the time they were here in the weather department. April 22nd, 2015 - The station again hosted a group of 26 students from the Merrill High school. Again, these students got a tour of the whole station, but spend a majority of the time learning about the weather. May 6th, 2015- 13 Students for the Christ Lutheran School in Eagle River came to the station for a weather tour. The students got a tour of the

whole station, but focused mainly on the weather department. July 2015 Scouts Troop 427 toured the station, and mainly focused on the weather department. The troop, along with the group leaders, spend about an hour and a half with the weather department, learning all aspects of putting together a weather forecast.

2 WBA Scholarship

The station also participated in the WBA Scholarship search. WJFW ran a commercial for the WBA encouraging students to apply for the scholarship. The students could then come to the station, or contact the station for application. The applications were all sent into the WBA, and then the winner was decided.

4 School Appearances

The weather team makes many school visits during the reporting period. They talk to a variety of different age groups when they visit the school.
