WPNA 103.1 FM Programs Addressing Public and Community Issues

During the second quarter of 2021, WPNA's bilingual (Polish/English) programming addressed the following issues of concern to the public:

1. All shows

Issue of concern: COVID-19 vaccinations

The show hosts discussed multiple times the spread of the coronavirus, the precautions that all of the members of the community should take and the benefits of getting vaccinated.

2. Morning with 103.1 FM (April 2, 9:00 a.m., segment duration 15 min.)

Issue of concern: Polish Easter traditions

What are the Polish traditions that make Easter so special? Magda (Morning Show) and Adela (Afternoon Show) discuss and educate the listeners about their favorite moments from Polish Easter celebrations.

3. Morning with 103.1 FM (June 12, 8:00 a.m., segment duration 5 min.)

Issue of concern: Covid-19 vaccinations event at Copernicus Center

The morning show hosts promoted a Covid-19 vaccinations event held at the Copernicus Center, reminding the listeners about the importance of getting vaccinated.

4. Afternoons with 103.1 FM (June 14, 3:00 p.m., segment duration 3 min.)

Issue of concern: Flag Day

The afternoon hosts reminded the listeners that Flag Day commemorates the adoption of the Stars and Stripes as the official flag of the United States.

5. Afternoons with 103.1 FM (June 18, 4:00 p.m., segment duration 4 min.)

Issue of concern: Juneteenth holiday

The afternoon hosts discussed the Juneteenth, a federal holiday commemorating the emancipation of African-American slaves, as an introduction to the Juneteenth Special in The Underbelly Review evening show dedicated to Black Chicagoans who have changed the world of music.

6. Afternoons with 103.1 FM (June 21, 3:00 p.m., segment duration 3 min.)

Issue of concern: Tornado assistance

After a radar-confirmed tornado tore through several western Chicago suburbs, a wide variety of organizations and companies were offering services to residents impacted by the storms. The afternoon hosts listed the companies and organizations offering assistance to residents in need and resources to use as clean-up from the storm continued.
