But Cambodia also brings some of her happiest encounters, as Sue's ability to make friends is epitomized in her meetings with a mobile phone touting hermit, and the women of the Krung people. The Krung live in the remote highlands of Ratanakiri and are one of the tribes most affected by rapid deforestation. Having witnessed the devastation of the forest from the air, Sue makes a deep bond with these women, as she sees how they live from the bounty of the remaining forest and learns of their struggle to protect it.
