COMMERCIAL LIMIT CERTIFICATION

I, Amanda Lynch, in my capacity as Programming Coordinator of television station ENKY, Channel 40.2, BOWLING GREEN, KY, hereby certify that for the period from October 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013:

1) I am familiar with the commercial limits imposed by Section 73.760(a) of the FCC's rules (no more than 12 minutes per hour of commercial material may be broadcast during children's programming¹ during the week, and no more than 10 ½ minutes per hour on weekends) and that commercial matter means air time sold for the purpose of selling a product or service *as well as* promotions of television programs or video services other than children's or other age-appropriate programming appearing on the same channel or promotions for children's educational and information programming on any channel;

2) I am familiar with the requirement in Section 73.760(b) of the FCC's rules that display of website addresses during children's program material, or promotional material not counted as commercial time, is permitted only if: a) the website offers a substantial amount of *bona fide* program-related or other noncommercial content; b) the website is not primarily intended for commercial purposes, including either e-commerce or advertising; c) the website's home page or other menu pages are clearly labeled to distinguish the noncommercial from the commercial sections; and d) the page of the website to which viewers are directed is not used for e-commerce, advertising, or other commercial purposes (*e.g.*, has no links labeled "store" and no links to another page with commercial material).

3) I am aware that Section 73.760(c) of the FCC's rules provides that if the Internet address for the website does not meet the above 4-prong test, in addition to counting as commercial time, it must be clearly separated from program material.

4) I am familiar with Section 73.760(d) of the FCC's rules which prohibits the display of website addresses in or adjacent to children's program material, if, at that time, on pages that are primarily devoted to free noncommercial content regarding that specific program or a character in that specific program: (i) products are sold that feature a character appearing in that program; or (ii) a character in that program is used to actively sell products or services.

5) Attached as Exhibit 1 is a true and correct list of all children's programming aired during the period listed above (both educational and informational ("E/I") programming and other entertainment programming targeting children ages 12 and under);

Under the FCC's children's television rules relating to informational and educational programming, every commercial television station is normally required to prepare and place in its public file a Children's Television Programming Report on FCC Form 398 by the tenth day following the end of each calendar quarter. The report for the Fourth Quarter is due to be placed in the public file by January 10, 2014.

Attached are pages from the FCC's Form 398 Report which include information as to the CBS Television Network's educational and informational children's programming scheduled during Fourth Quarter, 2013. Please note that these pages are being provided to you with only portions of the necessary information completed. Information relating to network programming has been filled out, but additional information regarding your broadcast (and preemption) of network programming, and all the required information relating to your qualifying non-network programming, must be completed by you. Completing the rest of the form is also, of course, your responsibility.

The partially completed Form 398 Report is also available to you on a website (<http://www.form398.car.cbs.com/>). To access the website, you need to enter the following information:

User Name: form398 (all lower case)

Password: car398 (all lower case)

As you know, the FCC's deadline for cessation of analog broadcasting passed prior to the Third Quarter, 2009. The Commission, however, has not revised the Form 398 to omit Questions 2-6, which seek information relating to licensees' analog broadcast of children's programming. In light of the June 2009 deadline for transition to digital broadcasting, we recommend leaving Questions 2-6 on the existing Form 398 blank. Similarly, we recommend leaving blank Question 7(b), which asks if the licensee broadcast on its main digital program stream the same children's program provided on its analog channel, and Question 7(c), which refers to representations and information provided with respect to analog programming. If you encounter difficulties filing your report with these questions left blank, you may wish to consult your own counsel.

The FCC's license renewal guidelines require the broadcast of three hours per week of "core" educational programming for children. Questions 7-11, which deal with the broadcast of core digital children's programming, must be answered for

qualifying programming broadcast in the quarter. Please note the following in responding to these questions.

Question 7(a) calls for the average number of hours of core digital programming broadcast by the station during the preceding calendar quarter. As you know, the Network offers three hours of qualifying core programming for broadcast each weekend. Please note, however, that the number of hours you report in response to Question 7(a) may differ if you did not broadcast all the core programming supplied by the Network, or if you broadcast additional local or syndicated educational programming that you determine meets the FCC's definition of core programming.

Question 9 (a) requires stations to indicate for their digital core programming whether they identify each program as educational and provide information as to the program's target child audience to publishers of program guides. Question 9 (b) requires stations to identify the publishers of program guides to whom they send this information. The Network identifies to program guide publishers network programs that are educational and informational and their target ages, and, in response to Question 9(b), the Network has supplied the identities of the publishers to whom it provides information. We have previously suggested that you also supply this information, both as to qualifying network and non-network programs, in the local schedules you provide to program guides and listing services. Assuming you do so, you should be able to answer Question 9(a) in the affirmative, and you should add the identities of the publishers to whom you send information after the Network portion of the answer to Question 9(b).

The Network is providing the descriptive information required by Question 10 as to each of its digital core programs scheduled in the Fourth Quarter. This descriptive material includes a final sentence for each program indicating that it meets the definition of core programming. It is your obligation, however, to verify that you have met the core programming criteria that are within your control (for example, that the program is regularly scheduled on a weekly basis, airs between 7:00 AM and 10:00 PM, and is appropriately identified to publishers of program guides).

In responding to Question 10, you also will be responsible for indicating on the form the days and times on which you broadcast the programming and for providing information on preemptions of the programming on your station. Please note that Question 10 calls for the "day," and not the "date," on which the program is "regularly scheduled." So, for example, an appropriate response to the question's request for information about the "Days/Times" on which the program is broadcast would be "Saturday, 7-7:30 AM."

As you know, the Network is providing the three hours of core programming to you, both by closed circuit prior to each weekend and by "live" feeds on Saturday morning, in accordance with the order wire for the programs. Because each station

schedules the programming, CBS cannot provide you with a listing of the dates and times of broadcast, or of network preemptions.

A Preemption Report must be completed for each core program that has been preempted during the quarter. The Preemption Report, which follows each program entry in Question 10 in the form, should include the total number of times a program aired during the quarter (including the number of times the program aired at its regularly scheduled date and time and the number of times any rescheduled programs aired), the number of times it was preempted, and the number of preemptions that were rescheduled. In addition, the Preemption Report should indicate, for each preempted program episode: the date the episode was preempted; if rescheduled, the date and time the episode was rescheduled; whether promotional efforts were made to notify the public of the rescheduled date and time; whether the episode was rescheduled to the program's "second home" (i.e. a fixed time period to which the program is rescheduled when preempted); and the reason for the preemption.

Each station will be required to complete Question 10 and, if applicable, a Preemption Report, in their entirety with respect to any syndicated or local core program which it broadcasts.

Finally, Question 10 requires stations to indicate whether they display the E/I symbol throughout each program. The Network feeds out the programs with the E/I logo on all programming elements. If you are displaying the E/I logo as fed, you should be in a position to answer these questions in the affirmative.

Stations should respond to Question 12 (concerning the station's broadcast of "non-core" digital educational programming, respectively) by listing any programs they have broadcast during the preceding quarter which are specifically designed to meet the educational and informational needs of children, but do not meet one of the defined elements of core programming. For example, educational/informational children's programs which were not regularly-scheduled as defined by the Commission, or which were broadcast prior to 7 AM, should be listed in response to this question.

Question 12 requires stations to indicate similar information regarding "non-core" programming as they are asked to provide for core programming. Please refer to the discussion of Questions 9 and 10 above for information that will assist you in answering these portions of Question 12.

Please note that Question 12 must be answered for each non-network educational and informational children's program you broadcast, as well as for the network programs. It is your responsibility to provide all the requested information regarding any non-core local or syndicated educational programming you broadcast.

Questions 8 and 11 address the requirement to broadcast additional core children's programming if the station broadcasts digital programming in addition to the programming broadcast on its main digital stream.

- Question 8(a) requires the station to state the average number of hours per week of free over-the-air digital programming broadcast by the station on other than its main program stream.
- Question 8(b) requires the station to state the average number of hours per week of core children's programming broadcast on other than its main program stream.
- Question 11 requires the station to certify that at least 50% of the core programming counted toward meeting the additional programming guideline (applied to free video programming aired on other than the main program stream) did not consist of program episodes that had already aired within the previous seven days either on the station's main digital program stream or on another of the station's free digital program streams.

If your station does not broadcast any additional digital program stream other than its main digital channel, you should answer "0" to questions 8(a) and (b). In this case, the appropriate answer to question 11 would be "not applicable," but because this answer is not an option, you may need to answer "No." You may then be prompted to submit a "Statement of Explanation," in which case you should explain that your station does not broadcast any digital program stream other than on its main digital stream.

If your station does broadcast additional digital programming on other than its main digital channel, you may wish to consult your counsel regarding your responses to Questions 8 and 11.

Question 14 seeks information regarding core programming you plan to broadcast in the next quarter. For network programming, we are providing the basic information, including each program's title, origination, length, target age and the required descriptive information. You will need to supply the days and times you plan to broadcast the network programs, as well as all relevant information regarding the non-network programs you plan to broadcast in the next quarter. You may also wish to state that the programming is to be broadcast on the station's digital channel.

To the extent there have been relevant non-broadcast efforts that will enhance the educational and informational value of core or non-core network programming, we will report them in response to Question 17. There were no such non-broadcast efforts in Fourth Quarter, 2013. You will need to report any relevant non-broadcast efforts you have made.

Due to the 11:30AM ET start time of "COLLEGE FOOTBALL ON CBS: AIR FORCE @ NAVY" game on Saturday, October 5, we provided stations with a pre-feed on Thursday/Friday, September 26/27 of all six "THE CBS DREAM TEAM, IT'S EPIC!" children's programs that were scheduled to air on October 5, 2013.

The state's coroner ruled that the cause of death was suicide by hanging. In 2009, Russ Boatright was assigned full-time to the circumstantial case. Investigation led to a sex tape, and Dan's fascination with bondage and rope. Heather was found bound in a similar manner. In 2011, Dan DeWild, David DeWild and his wife Roseanne were arrested and charged with murder. David DeWild broke down and admitted that his brother Dan had killed Heather and that he had participated in the crime. Prosecutors then learned that the brothers had been watching television crime dramas and forensic shows. They believed that Heather had gone to the house to retrieve the sex tape and then was killed. David DeWild took investigators to the crime scene and re-enacted what happened. David had to pass a polygraph test in order to secure a plea deal. Roseanne's charges were dropped due to lack of evidence. Dan DeWild's trial hinged almost entirely on his brother's testimony and with the lack of physical evidence, prosecutors hoped it was enough. In the end, it wasn't. Jurors deadlocked on the first degree murder charge, but agreed on the lesser charges. Plans were started for a retrial, but a month after the conviction, Dan DeWild pled guilty to second degree murder in a plea deal. **On-screen text graphic:** The identical twins have been separated...they are housed in different prisons. Redding was found dead in her Santa Monica, California home. According to authorities, the killer hoped to erase any evidence of the crime; the killer tried to blow up the entire crime scene by leaving the gas on and a candle burning. This did not happen, and there was plenty of DNA evidence remaining at the scene. A sometime boyfriend, John Gilmore, who had a history of violent behavior had an alibi and was cleared. Further investigation led to the discovery that Redding had recently broken up with her wealthy boyfriend, Dr. Munir Uwayda after learning he had a wife and children in Lebanon. Investigators also learned of a lucrative business deal offered to Redding's pharmacist father. Less than a week after the deal fell apart, Redding was dead. Inside the home, police found evidence of a struggle and DNA evidence that led to a woman: Kelly Soo Park. Park was in the employ of Dr. Uwayda. She was arrested and within days Uwayda had vanished. Five years later, the trial commenced. While authorities thought the case was an easy win, the defense, with the help of jury consultant Lee Meihls, presented a bold argument of DNA transference. The eventual outcome: Park was found not guilty. **On-screen text graphic:** The fraud investigation of Doctor Munir Uwaydah continues. His California Medical license has been canceled. Kelly Soo Park is living in Southern California managing a restaurant. They went on trial separately and both were convicted. In 2009, the Indiana Supreme Court overturned Camm's second conviction. Boney's conviction still stood. His wife's parents still believed Camm was guilty. The State decided to try him a third time. Defense attorneys used a different strategy, involving DNA. In this trial, Boney testified that he provided Camm with the gun and that any of his DNA was put there by Camm. Camm was found not guilty. **On-screen text graphic:** David Camm is working with the group "Investigating Innocence," based in Illinois. He's a case worker helping others who have been wrongfully convicted. David Camm's legal team is exploring a potential lawsuit against the State of Indiana. There are signs all along Highway 16 warning women not to hitchhike because a killer might be on the loose, but the murders have not ceased. Police arrested 20-year-old Cody Legebokoff in Leslie's murder. A patrolman pulled him over, thinking he was poaching game. He had Leslie's ID in his truck. Her body was just down the road. Legebokoff has since been identified as the alleged killer of three others, though police have not revealed how they've connected him to the murders that occurred in 2009 and 2010. Still, because of his age, police know Legebokoff couldn't be responsible for all of the murders along Highway 16. Just two months ago, officials at the Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) got a break in some cases because they linked DNA samples from one of the highway's victims, Colleen MacMillen, found murdered in 1974, to Bobby Jack Fowler. Police also believe Fowler, a Texas native who worked as a roofer in Prince George, may have killed as many as twenty people in the United States and Canada. Although brutally wounded, Busby was able to write a note for police at the scene that said "Not an accident. Mel Reine." Melvin Reine, a convicted arsonist and suspected murderer of three people, was a local thug whose brother, John Reine, had been arrested by John Busby. For undetermined reasons, Melvin Reine had long intimidated the Falmouth police, and the attempted murder of John Busby was not aggressively investigated. Fearing for their safety, the Busby family moved to an undisclosed location in Tennessee. Twenty-four years after the shooting, in 2003, John Reine confessed to the police that his brother Melvin had indeed shot John Busby while he, Melvin, drove the car. However, because of the statute of limitations, the Reines will remain unpunished. Melvin is now institutionalized, in a state of dementia. "The Stranger You Know" (10:00-11:00) - a report about Marti Hill, who was savagely beaten in her Prairie Village, Kansas home -- and her attacker, who refuses to say why. Hill did not show up for work one day in September 2010, and her co-workers grew concerned when she did not answer texts or phone calls. Police were summoned after Hill's boss drove to her home and found her car still in the driveway. She was found by police, at the bottom of the basement steps, barely breathing and covered in blood. Believing she was dying, Prairie Village Police Officer Bill Baldwin tried to coax out of her who was behind the vicious attack. Doctors were not sure that she would survive; she was beaten and her throat slashed open. They spent hours treating her. Police found out that Marti was a workaholic, and if she was not working, she was at home. Her ex-husband was ruled out as a suspect. Hill's mother alerted police towards Brian Pennington, a construction worker whom both she and Marti had hired to do work. Police questioned him and became suspicious, but needed to hear Marti's side of the story. They soon learned she was recovering and able to talk to police. She confirmed to police that Brian Pennington had attacked her; he was arrested for attempted first-degree murder. Frustrating to police was the fact that Pennington apparently had absolutely no motive. However, they found that he had a record of over sixty contacts with law enforcement officers, including several domestic violence incidents involving women. During the preliminary hearing, Pennington eventually agreed to a plea deal; the only issue would be how long he would be held in the Kansas State prison system. It took months, but finally a twenty-eight-and-a-half year prison sentence was agreed upon. To this day, no one knows why Pennington attacked Marti Hill. **Onscreen text graphic:** We wrote to Brian Pennington to ask why he attacked Marti Hill. He did not respond. "Living in the Shadows: Religion's Response to Human Trafficking" - a report on efforts by faith communities to educate the public on the prevalence of human trafficking -- forced labor and sexual exploitation. The International Labor Organization conservatively estimates that worldwide, including the United States, there are twenty-one million enslaved people. Labor and sex trafficking is the third largest illegal "business" in the world, after drug and arms trafficking. The topics include: (1) The effort to raise awareness about the occurrence of sex trafficking in the hospitality industry. Includes comments from: Sister Patricia Daly, OP, Tri-State Coalition for Responsible Investment; and Carol Smolenski, ECPAT USA. Also highlighted is a volunteer training session at St. Ignatius Loyola Catholic Church on the Upper Eastside of Manhattan, attended by high school students from St. Ignatius Loyola, other local faith leaders, and concerned community members. (2) United Methodist Reverend David Schilling of the Human Rights and Resources for the Interfaith Center on Corporate Responsibility (ICCR), details his organization's efforts to raise the awareness of corporations about global supply chain abuses, highlighting their recent work in Bangladesh. (3) Rabbi Rachel Kahn-Troster describes the efforts of the Jewish human rights organization T'ruah, in partnership with the Coalition of Immokalee Workers, to protect migrant workers on tomato farms in Florida. (4) The Damayan Migrant Workers Association is a grassroots advocacy organization for domestic workers from the Philippines in the New York area. Founding member Linda Oalican, and campaign and case manager Leah Obias, discuss the alliance of the faith community with their organization. Also includes comments from: Lydia Catina Amaya, staff community organizer; Karen Prudente, a member of United Methodist Women; and Susie Johnson, an executive for Public Policy with United Methodist Women. (5) In January 2013, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops created a pilot program called the Amistad Movement.
