The result is a band that's both rock solid and highly adaptive. Texas Hill is instantly identifiable, thanks to its well-developed signature sound: a proud, in-your-face harmonic wall. But each of the three singers can, and does, take over the lead, inevitably pushing the group in his own unique direction while those harmonies allow the whole ensemble to hang on to its sonic center.

The event will be in Whitetail Run and Green Jay Lane day-use areas. Be sure to bring weather appropriate clothing, water, and sun protection. This is one of many 100-year celebration events happening in Texas state parks this year. Entry to the park is free on the day of the official 100-Year Celebration (applies to day passes only). Reserve your free day pass online to guarantee entry to the park. Upon arrival the day of the event, the first 500 participants may signup to participate. Reserving a day pass online does not guarantee participation in Kid Fish 2023. Wristbands that grant entry into the youth fishing area are passed out at the front office on a first come, first serve basis starting at 8am the day of the event.
