Secrets of the Dead: Scanning the Pyramids

Tuesday, October 1 from 8:00-9:00 pm

Travel with the scientific team granted unprecedented access by the Egyptian government to solve a 4,500-year-old mystery: what lies within the Great Pyramid at Giza. Using non-invasive technologies, they make a historic discovery.

Frontline: The Crown Prince of Saudi Arabia (NEW)

Tuesday, October 1 from 9:00-11:00 pm

The murder of *Washington Post* columnist Jamal Khashoggi drew the world's attention to the young Crown Prince of Saudi Arabia, Mohammed bin Salman (MBS). *Frontline* investigates the rise of MBS, his vision for the future, his handling of dissent, and Khashoggi's murder.

Nature: Octopus - Making Contact (NEW)

Wednesday, October 2 from 8:00-9:00 pm

Follow an Alaskan professor as he raises and studies a pet octopus in his home, making remarkable discoveries about its extraordinary skills.

NOVA: Inside the Megafire

Wednesday, October 2 from 9:00-10:00 pm

From the front line of the Camp Fire, the deadliest wildfire in California history, NOVA tells the stories of residents who had to flee for their lives during the 2018 fire season. Scientists racing to understand what's behind the rise of record-breaking megafires across the American West take to the forest, and even a fire lab, in search of answers. They investigate how forestry practices, climate change, and the physics of fire itself play a role in the dramatic increase in wildfires in recent decades.

This natural history series reveals the world's most extraordinary wildlife living in the newest and fastest changing habitat on the planet: cities. Explore our most-loved and familiar cities through fresh eyes: the eyes of the animals that live in them. In this episode: cities may seem unlikely havens for wildlife, but for animals able to adapt, the urban world is filled with opportunity.
