The National Human Trafficking Hotline reports that there were 119 cases reported in Virginia in 2020. Non-profit organization Freedom 424 works to educate parents and young people about human trafficking (how to recognize it, report it, prevention). The organization works in the US and through international partners. The interview also covered Freedom 424's awareness event coming up April 19-20, 2022. Tania Conner explained how listeners can participate in the Run for Their Lives event and how it supports Freedom 424's efforts to educate the public about human trafficking and exploitation.
