World Wildlife Fund – “Be The Voice” When valuable species and natural resources are being threatened, they can’t speak out and ask for help, but we can. This PSA is designed to touch people’s hearts and encourage them to speak out for animals and those vulnerable, beautiful and life-sustaining things on earth that we hope to protect.

Crime:

National Crime Prevention – “Intellectual Property” – The National Crime Prevention Council, in partnership with the Bureau of Justice Assistance, Office of Justice Programs and U.S. Department of Justice, has launched a campaign against intellectual property theft. These ads encourage the public not to buy counterfeit items, and show ways how the innocent are exploited.

Economy/Jobs:

Broadband Opportunity Coalition – “Connect Today” During his State of the Union Address this year, President Obama recognized the vital role the Internet and technology plays in strengthening our country and our economy. He stated, in the next five years we will make it possible for business to deploy the next generation of high speed wireless coverage to 98% of all Americans. To help meet that goal, the National Telecommunications and information Administration (NTIA) has allocated funding to help bring essential broadband access and technology to underserved communities throughout the United States.

U.S. Navy Recruitment – “Start Something” What the Navy do for the world, you can do for your neighbors. The men and women of America’s Navy do some amazing things to make the world a better place. So can you, whether it’s by donating food or simply giving time right in your own back yard.

Alabama Broadcasters Association – “Born Ready” This Born Ready campaign is designed to attract reservists. Because Alabama is a coastal state, there is a great opportunity for persons to serve in the Coast Guard Reserve. The “Workout” campaign also aired.

Alabama Broadcasters Association – “Alabama National Guard” Tells about opportunities for employment and to serve in Alabama’s National Guard.

U.S. Marines – “For Us All” For more than 235 years the men and women of the United States Marines Corps have made a commitment to defend the American way of life. They are from your city, your hometown, your nation. No matter where their mission takes them, they remain faithful to protecting the place they call home. Every day they take a stand – for pride of the nation; for country; for us all.

Education:

Ad Council – “Mentoring-Big Brothers Big Sisters” There are over 75,000,000 children in the US, and nearly 10,000,000 of them are at risk. What if every child was sent on the right path? What if every child stayed in school? Got a job? Gave back to the community? What if every child’s potential was fulfilled? The Ad Council in partnership with Big Brothers/Big Sisters developed these PSAs which urge people to

make an impact in the lives of children and start something today at BigBrothersBigSisters.org.

Alabama Public Library Service “Homework Alabama” – This statewide effort is made possible through local public libraries, with funding from the Institute of Museum and Library Services through their Library Services and Technology Act grant program as well as appropriated by the State Legislature specifically for this program. It offers free homework help from subject specialists in Math, Science, Social Studies, and English for grades K-13, college intro, and adult learner.

Montgomery County Family & Juvenile Truancy “The Truancy Intervention Program (TIP)”, administered by the Helping Montgomery Families Initiative, was piloted at Davis Elementary, E.D. Nixon Elementary and Bellingrath Middle schools. It will now be expanded to all MPS schools. This expansion is important because TIP requires families to be accountable by providing a supportive system that helps families keep their child in school. TIP is a collaborative effort by school officials, law enforcement and social services agencies to intervene in the lives of students who do not regularly attend school.

Health:

Ad Council – “Buzzed Driving is Drunk Driving” Make sure you make responsible choices that don't endanger yourself and others. Take the pledge.

Ad Council – “Autism Awareness” - BBDO, the agency for the Autism Awareness campaign, created a video case study to highlight the effectiveness of the award-winning PSAs. Since the launch of the campaign, parents are 160% more likely to be aware of the prevalence of Autism and 93% are more likely to recognize at least one key sign of Autism.

Ad Council – “Caregiver Assistance” Family support is critical to the care needed for older adults as they age, but often comes at substantial costs to those providing the care, to their families and to society. This PSA raises awareness about available resources are available; it connect caregivers with others who can be supportive; and it encourage them to call or visit a website for more information.

Ad Council - “Child Passenger Safety” Motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death for children age 1 through 12 years old. Based on NHTSA crash data in 2010, almost an average of 2 children (age 13 and younger in a passenger vehicle) were killed and 325 were injured each day. This fatality rate could be reduced by about half if the correct child safety seat were always used.

Ad Council – “Food Safety Education” This PSA raises awareness of the risk of food poisoning; and motivates consumers to take action to reduce their personal risk of food poisoning and achieve safe food handling behaviors – Clean, Separate, Cook and Chill.

Ad Council – “Lead Poisoning” This PSA encourages parents to know their home’s lead danger zones and get their children tested during Lead Poisoning Prevention Week and beyond.

Ad Council – “Newborn & Child Survival” – Every year, approximately 7 million children in the developing world die of largely preventable or treatable causes before they reach the age of 5. This campaign engages the American public in a movement supporting the work of frontline health workers who deliver lifesaving care to millions of children around the world.

Ad Council – “New Odds 1 in 88” – This ad compares the odds of a person achieving everything that some of their role models have achieved to the odds of having a child diagnosed with Autism (1 to 88) and encourages the parents to learn the signs of Autism. Early diagnosis can make a lifetime of difference. Toni Braxton, Ernie Els, Tommy Hilfiger, and Jamie McMurray are stars featured in these PSAs.

American Association of Orthopedic Surgeons – “Joints Don’t Jump” Joint pain affects the quality of life for millions nationwide. Viewers are encouraged to seek information from orthoinfo.org to keep healthy joints healthy and make sore joints feel good again.

Health and Human Services – “The Most Important of All”; “Succeed in Life” – Studies show that physical activity not only helps kids stay healthy . . . it can enhance important skills like concentration and problem solving, which can improve academic performance.

National Meningitis Association – “Get Vaccinated” The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and other leading medical groups recommend vaccination for preteens, teens, and college freshmen living in dorms to protect them from meningococcal meningitis, a deadly disease. Yet many parents are unaware of these recommendations.

Ad Council – “Let’s Move” First Lady Michelle Obama’s Let’s Move! Initiative has an ambitious but important goal: to solve the epidemic of childhood obesity within a generation. Let’s move employs a comprehensive approach set to engage every sector of society impacting the health of children and will provide schools, families and communities simple tools to help kids be active, eat better, and get healthy.

Share Our Strength – “No Kid Hungry” – Nearly 17,000,000 children in the United States don’t have reliable access to the food they need to lead healthy, active lives. Our kids aren’t hungry because we lack food or because of a lack of food and nutrition programs. They are hungry because they lack access to the nutritious foods they need to grow and thrive.

Recreation/Lifestyles:

Alabama Broadcasting Association – “Adoption Foster Care” This announcement asks the public to open their hearts and minds to Alabama’s children and to consider becoming foster parents to those children needing homes and parenting.

Alabama Dance Theater – “Dracula”, The Alabama Dance Theater hosted a ballet to die for! On October 27th and 28th at the Alabama Shakespeare Festival.

National Safety Council – “On The Road/Off The Phone” As new drivers, teens face numerous road safety risks. This PSA encourages the parents to speak directly to their teens about the dangers of texting or talking on the phone while driving and make “no texting or talking” part of the rules of the car.

Boystown of America – “Outline Teen”, “Their World Parent” Over the past 20 years the Boys Town National Hotline has helped more than 8,000,000 teens, parents and families. The hotline is opened 24 hours a day, 365 days a year and staffed by specially trained counselors. Parents, teens and families can find help with anything that concerns youth.

Boystown National Hotline – This campaign features one PSA targeted to teens and the other reaching out to parents. Both speak to the power of improving difficult situations in your life by making one small change at a time. The hotline has helped more than 8 million callers dealing with problems such as depression, thoughts of suicide, drug or alcohol abuse, school issues and family relationships to name a few.

Brantwood Children’s Home – “Resolution Run” – This PSA promoted the upcoming run to be held on January 5, 2013 that will benefit the Brantwood Children’s Home.
