## AFFAIRS AND PROGRAMS LIST

### How Issues and Problems are identified

The following list of issues and problems was prepared by the Public Affairs Department of WBZA-FM/ WBZA-HD1, Rochester, NY.

WBZA-FM/ WBZA-HD1, on a daily and on-going basis, examines and attempts to determine the needs of the community during regular news coverage (includes TV and newspaper). Events being covered by WBZA-FM/ WBZA-HD1 news broadcasts, which run every half-hour between 6:20am and 8:50 am, Monday through Friday, also help determine the direction of community affairs programming. In addition, portions of public affairs programs are aired in actuality format in Morning Drive news broadcasts to add awareness and to better highlight community concerns and issues during the most-listened-to portion of the station's broadcast day.

The WBZA-FM/ WBZA-HD1 Public Affairs Department has listed a general overview of issues and problems for our coverage area. That overview for the Second Quarter of 2020 is attached to this report. The list of programs that addressed these specific issues is also attached.

The program deals with matters of concern to our listeners, including (but not limited to) minority issues, family, health and human services, and political issues.
