## 1. Crime, Drugs

12P Sonic Armed Robbery-vo

:15 10/22

Meanwhile the search is on for another suspect who robbed a metro restaurant with a knife.

The robbery happened early this morning at the Sonic on Southwest 89th and May.

Police say the man threatened employees with a knife and then took off with a change container.

No word on a description of that suspect.

12P-PALMA CHARGES EXTENSION

:20 10/20

Police plan to seek a deadline extension to file formal charges against Anthony Palma.

Palma is suspected of kidnapping 8-year-old Kirsten Hatfield from her home back in 1997.

D-N-A evidence recently linked Palma to the crime. Police have been searching his home for the past week looking for more evidence in the case.

12P-39TH & PORTLAND STABBING

1:00 10/14

Oklahoma city police are investigating after a violent attack at a metro motel. Around 9:45 this morning officers responded to two calls. One here at the hospitality inn and another at the jimmys egg restaurant next door.

12P Yukon Pursuit & Crash

:25 11/26

An officer was hurt overnight -- after suspects rammed a police cruiser during a pursuit.

Around 10 o'clock police say two suspects threatened a woman with a knife -- then stole her truck.

Officers saw the truck near I-40 and Rockwell and tried to pull the driver over -- but they did not stop.

#### 12P-SW OKC ROBBERY

:20 11/24

Police are searching for three suspects who robbed a man at gunpoint in Southwest OKC.

Police say the two men and a woman asked the victim for help before stealing the man's car phone, and wallet.

#### 12P-FLASHER ARRESTED

A man faces indecent exposure charges after allegedly exposing himself to a woman while she was getting into her car.

Police say Hayden Taylor exposed himself to the woman near Northwest 122nd and May as she left work.

Police are afraid kids and parents will mistake them for Sweet Tarts, Sprees or Smarties.

The drug can cause severe hallucinations.

An Texas indoor skydiving venue filled with kids last night as flyers took part in the kids indoor skydiving national championship.

Teams performed routines yesterday hoping to make the podium judged on style and skill.

12P-NORMAN NORTH THREAT

1:15 10/5

A threatening message on a bathroom stall causes a flurry of activity at Norman North.

Parents rushed to pick up their children after a student finds a message in a women's restroom warning of a school shooting today.

12P At Risk Teens Thanksgiving Farm

1:30 11/26

A high school in California is giving at-risk students a unique last chance to get an education.

Teenagers are earning their diplomas by working on a farm.

1:50 11/26

Standing at 6 foot 11 - Thunder Center Enes Kanter put the basketball down, and put the hair and beard net on for a good cause.

He's assembling 25 taco salads to go out to OKC'S Van Buren Elementary School's Kid's Cafe - which serves at risk kids.

## 12P Kids' Cup Choking Risk

:25 11/11

A recall alert to warn you about.

130-thousand "Bueno by Contigo" kids straw tumblers are being pulled off store shelves.

The company says pieces of the drinking straw can break off into a child's mouth posing indigestion or choking risks.

## 12P-LETTERS TO SANTA

:30 12/25

Now that Old Saint Nick has made his big trip around the world.. we're getting a look at the letters he received this year from kids hoping for gifts instead of coal.

## 12P Bean Bag Chair Deaths

:20 12/18

The Consumer Product Safety Commission has \*re-issued a recall for more than 2 million 'Ace Bayou' bean bag chairs.

The chairs are blamed for the deaths of two children. Safety regulators say the zippers can be opened by kids, who can then crawl inside, get trapped and suffocate. A repair kit is available from the company.

### **3. Civic, Neighborhood**

12P National Weather Festival

:30 10/29

News 9 will be in the neighborhood this weekend.

Our very own Lacey Swope and the whole weather team will be at the National Weather Festival this Saturday.

The crew will be down in Norman at the National Weather Center between 10 and 2.

300 lucky people will leave the festival with a free antenna.

News 9's has partnered with the National Association of Broadcasters and Antennas Direct for the Antenna Giveaway.

12P-TEN COMMANDMENTS REMOVED

:30 10/6

The Ten Commandments monument has been removed from Capitol Grounds.

The monument now sits in front of the Oklahoma Council of Public Affairs.

Originally donated and erected in 20-12, several groups began lobbying for it's removal.

Back in June the Oklahoma Supreme Court ruled that the display on state grounds violates the state constitution.

The state paid a private contractor 47-hundred dollars to remove the 48-hundred pound monument last night.

12P Real ID Law Update

:15 10/7

Legislation to bring Oklahoma I-D's up to federal standards has been filed at the state capitol

Senate Bill 865 would bring Oklahoma driver licenses into compliance with the Real I-D Act of 2005.

Without changes, we will not be able to use our state-issued I-D to board a commercial flight.

#### 12P Lankford Waste Report

:25 11/30

Congress returned to Capitol Hill this morning where Oklahoma Senator released his waste and solutions report.

The report is entitled "Federal Fumbles: 100 ways to the government dropped the ball."

It highlights examples of wasteful or duplicative spending as well as a policy solution for each problem outlined.

Senator Lankford plans to talk with News 9 later today with more details on the report.

#### 12P State of Emergency

:15 11/30

Governor Fallin has declared a state of emergency for all 77 counties.

This allows state agencies to make emergency purchases for disaster relief and preparedness and is the first step towards asking for federal assistance.

The "state of emergency" lasts for 30 days.

#### 12P County Clerk Election

:20 11/4

Governor Mary Fallin has set a date for a special election for Oklahoma County Court Clerk.

Currently Tim Rhodes holds the post --but will step down to head to the Oklahoma Corporation Commission.

Candidates can file between December 7th and 9th.

A primary will be on March 1st and a general election is set for April 5th.

## 12P Fallin Disaster Declaration

:20 12/18

Governor Mary Fallin has requested a major disaster declaration for 18 Oklahoma counties affected by the Thanksgiving ice storm.

The storm killed two people and knocked out power to more than 125-thousand people.

The damage total comes in at nearly 20-million-dollars.

Caddo, Grady, Ellis, Oklahoma, Washita and Woods Counties are included in the request.

## 12P OCC Regulations Today

:25 12/2

The Oklahoma Corporation Commission plans to shut down some wells and reduce the volume at others.

Restricted operations have already started at more than 300 disposal wells in earthquake-prone areas of Oklahoma.

Meanwhile Governor Fallin is putting together a fact-finding group to look into ways to recycle wastewater instead of injecting it into disposal wells.

### 12P Online College App

1:30 10/26

A new app is offering the chance to earn a college degree on your iPad or tablet - at a low cost - without ever setting foot inside a classroom. Chris Martinez shows us how it works.

### 12P State Budget Short Fall

:25 10/22

Facing an expected budget shortfall next year...

Oklahoma lawmakers are taking a closer look at some of the roughly 3-point-6 BILLION dollars in state-appropriated funds.

A committee met yesterday to discuss so-called "pass through" funding which is described as funding for an agency that's spent somewhere else.

Included in the analysis is billions of dollars for public schools that is designated to the State Department of Education.

### 12P 4 Day School Week Debate

:40 11/18

More than 20 school superintendents met this morning to discuss implementing 4-day weeks.

Right now, about 35 districts already use the 4-day schedule.

Some districts report the shorter week helps them attract more teachers.

Others report being able to save 5 to 8-percent through utilities and transportation.

### 12P TPS Gender-Neutral Bathrooms

:35 11/13

Tulsa Public Schools has announced new guidelines for transgender students and faculty.

The district will have at least one "gender-neutral" restroom in each school.

School officials say new court decisions are forcing change, but there is no threat of legal action.

In September, T-P-S added gender identity to its anti-bullying policy.

12P Pott. County School Tax Approved

:15 11/11

Voters in Pottawatomie County passed a 10-year half-cent sales tax.. that will benefit all 14 school districts in the area.

Most of the money will pay for school improvements.

12P No Child Left Behind Changes

:30 12/10

The "Every Student Succeeds Act" is headed to President Obama's desk right now.

The new legislation will allow the state to have more control when it comes to testing and keeping schools accountable.

12P Penny Sales Tax Hearing Delay-vo

:20 12/8

A hearing scheduled today for the proposed penny sales tax has been postponed.

The Oklahoma Supreme Court planned to hear a challenge to the proposal, but one of the attorneys is sick.

The hearing has been moved to the 16th.

Supporters of the tax say it would generate 615-million dollars for education, but the opposition claims the proposal violates the state constitution.

## 12P-POST COMMON CORE STANDARDS

:20 12/16

The Oklahoma Academic Standards Steering Committee is meeting today and tomorrow as members work to develop a new curriculum. The committee was formed after the legislature repealed Common Core.

The new standards should be prepared by the 2016-2017 school year.

## 5. Traffic, Construction, Streets

12P-GAS LEAK-VO

:15 10/5

Crews evacuate three homes in Northwest Oklahoma City after a gas line leak in the area.

Fire crews say a contractor installing a pool in the 6800 block of Northwest 131st Street hit a medium pressure gas line causing the leak.

12P-PORTLAND LANE CHANGE 0:20 11/23

Crews are working to add left turn lanes in the area.

Left turns will be restricted from NB Portland to WB 150th during the rush hour -- that's 4 to 6pm.

12P Obama Rejects Pipeline-vo

:15 11/6

President Obama has officially rejected the Keystone X-L Pipeline, saying it would not serve the national interests..

The nearly 2-thousand mile underground pipeline would have carried oil from Canada -- through Oklahoma -- to the Gulf Coast.

Roads are a solid sheet of ice in most areas. Traffic is moving slower than usual. A few accidents to report around town.
