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## ISSUE 1: MANHOOD

They noted the importance of communication when it comes to money, marriage and financial decisions. They shared the four key steps to money management: Save all you can. Earn all you can. Give all you can. And then that last one, Enjoy it all.

They stressed parents should embrace their strengths as a parent, and as a result it will energize and help you find creative ways to overcome weaknesses. Dr. Schroeder expounded on the "perfect" parent, why appropriate physical and emotional love with your children is vital, and the attitude of gratitude you can create in your child's environment. Dr. Schroeder explained the importance of parents having flexible rules so that children begin to learn how to manage their own life.

He noted that as a result of reaching out 85% of the residents in nursing homes come to Christ. The Chaplain noted that this forgotten generation of precious people deserve our love and attention, and often times family members put them in homes for care, but never visit. In fact, about 80% of nursing home residents receive less than one visit a month from family or friends. He also cited ways that we can make a difference in the lives of our loved ones in nursing homes.
