Health/Environment	Local News 8 at 5A	10/2/2023	:38	After a nearly 10 month boil water order, the people of Island Park may finally have clean water soon. The Big Springs Water Company is now the court appointed custodian of the Island Park Water Company's assets. Home owners said the water system has had problems for years. The owner of Big Springs say they are working to correct those issues before the colder weather sets in.
Law Enforcemnet	Local News 8 at 6A	10/4/2023	:35	A woman charged with attempted murder, burglary and aggravated battery related to the stabbing of a man in Victor. The Teton County, Idaho Sherriff's office and Prosecutor's office say it happened Monday night. Luna Nicoya Phaedra Serrano is also charged with aggravated battery for another incident that happened on September 17th against the same man. When officers arrived, the man had been take to Teton Valley Hospital for multiple stab wounds and other injuries.

Some careers in demand include health care, cybersecurity and automotive technicians.

The Idaho GOP announced today that it will hold a caucus instead of a primary. This comes after the legislature failed to reconvene before the deadline set by the Republican National Committee. Earlier this year, Idaho legislators voted to eliminate the March election, but did not establish a new date for a Presidential primary. There was talk of possibly holding a special session to fix the issue but the deadline has now passed.

A national safety expert spoke on how to identify the warning signs to prevent these tragedies. Active shooter trainings help prepare students and teachers for the event of a school shooting.

According to Bonneville County Prosecutor Randy Neal, the injunction prevented the commission from notifying Bonneville County that District 91's most recent plant facility levy was 'unlawful'. The levy is a \$3.3 million dollar a year, 10 year plant facilities levy. The State Attorney General says school districts can't have concurrent plant facilities levies, which forces the Bonneville County Prosecutor to be involved.

The Ammon City Council held a 'Meet the Candidates' event. The candidates answered questions on city growth, infrastructure, and communication with fellow council members and city taxpayers.

The most frequent type of deadly crash in Idaho is when a single vehicle leaves the roadway and crashes. Drivers are often speeding, not wearing seat belts and/or driving impaired.

The national average for a gallon of whole milk sits at \$4.34. Idaho sits below that at \$2.96 but shoppers say they are still paying more for less food. According to US Bureau of Statistics, food is up nearly 4%.

State guidelines say you must give at least 7 days notice before an election. The GOP also says Craven's position was not yet vacant, the Bingham county Republicans disagree.
