The following are the issues of public importance identified by radio stations, WNXP, WZEW-FM, WZEW HD 2, and WZEW HD 3 in the 1st Quarter of 2022 for Mobile, Fairhope and the surrounding service area:

- 1) The improvement and protection of the environment in Mobile and Baldwin counties along with Mobile Bay and the Gulf of Mexico.
- 2) The need for funding and support of the Child Advocacy Center for victims of sexual and physical abuse within the Mobile/Fairhope area.
- 3) The need for volunteer action to support programs and services for non-profit agencies within the service area.
- 4) Support for, and education about, the arts and the role they play in our community.
- 5)) Updates on local news, events, and the latest Covid-19 Pandemic issues and information.

WZEW-FM and WNXP-FM offer extended airtime to legitimate public service groups through our liberal offering of airtime to legitimate public service groups. Helping Mobile's Children/Jesse's Army

American Heart Association
