Mobile "Make-Up" Blood Drive

(Mobile, AL)- The landfall of Isaac has disrupted the local collection of blood, forcing the cancellation of blood drives along the Gulf Coast for the last several days. As a result, the Alabama and Central Gulf Coast Blood Services Region will hold a "make-up" blood drive in Mobile on Thursday, August 30 and Friday, August 31 from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. each day in the Target Wing of Bel Air Mall.

Hurricane/Tropical Storm Isaac has forced the cancellation of a handful of blood drives along the Gulf Coast, resulting in nearly 500 donors unable to give blood as scheduled. Additional blood drives may be canceled in the days ahead, causing a shortfall of blood in the affected areas. Maintaining sufficient blood to meet patient needs is a delicate balance between supply and demand.

The summer is tough on the blood supply in our region for several reasons. First of all, school is out during the summer months. Students in high school and college comprise 21 percent of blood donors in this region, and when they aren't available for donations at their respective schools, the blood inventory suffers. Also, because the summertime is a period filled with outdoor recreation, increased outside labor and more frequent vacation travel, an increase in the number of accidents has historically served to further deplete the blood supply.

The situation is further compounded by the increase in the frequency of dangerous tropical activity during the summer months in the form of hurricanes and tropical storms, both of which not only cause an increase in the demand for blood but also disrupt collection efforts. These factors together create one of the toughest times of the year for the blood inventory, and the American Red Cross counts on selfless donors to roll up their sleeves and fill in the gaps in the blood supply through summer blood drives.

Because blood can be separated into three components – blood, platelets and plasma – one donation can benefit up to three individuals. Because it takes up to three days for blood to be processed and made available to hospitals, it is important that a donation be made ahead of an emergency. If everyone who was eligible would donate four times a year, there would never be a blood shortage.

All presenting volunteer donors in the months of July, August and September are entered into the July "Super Summer Save" promotion for a chance at \$3,000 in American Express gift cards.

Mobile county is currently under a hurricane warning, a hurricane warning means that hurricane conditions are expected somewhere within the warning area. A warning is typically issued 36 hours before the anticipated first occurrence of tropical storm force winds...conditions that make outside preparations difficult or dangerous. Preparations to protect life and property should be rushed to completion.

Governor Bentley has issued a state of emergency and a mandatory evacuation for zones 1 and 2 of mobile county.

Citizens are advised to evacuate from coastal, low lying, and flood prone areas to higher ground and a safer area. Also citizens in sub-standard or manufactured housing should evacuate to a safer structure and out of any flood prone areas.

Stay tuned to your local media outlets for upcoming information regarding shelter locations and opening times. Stay tuned for information regarding assisted evacuation.

Currently the tropical storm center located near $25.2n\ 84.2w$ at 27/0900z position accurate within $25\ nm$.

Now is the time to make those final preparations and get food and water, medications, and any other items that you will need for the storm landfall and the immediate time after the landfall. Now is also the time to make your evacuation decision and decide where you will go to get your family out of harm's way.

Ts storm isaac has a high probability of uncertainty in regards to storm strength and the final landfall location. Citizens need to monitor the situation and maintain situational awareness as this storm continues to move towards the gulf coast.
