WZEW and WNSP ISSUES and PROGRAMMING TO ADDRESS THOSE ISSUES, 2nd Quarter, 2018

The following are the issues of public importance identified by radio station WZEW-FM and WNSP-FM in the 1st Quarter of 2017 for Mobile, Fairhope and the surrounding service area:

- 1) The improvement and protection of the environment in Mobile and Baldwin counties along with Mobile Bay and the Gulf of Mexico.
- 2) The need for funding and support of the Child Advocacy Center for victims of sexual and physical abuse within the Mobile/Fairhope area.

Public News/Lagniappe
