

WZEW ISSUES and PROGRAMMING TO ADDRESS THOSE ISSUES, 3rd Quarter, 2013

The following are the issues of public importance identified by radio station WZEW-FM in the 3rd Quarter of 2013 for Fairhope, Mobile and the surrounding service areas:

- 1) The improvement and protection of the environment in Mobile and Baldwin counties along with Mobile Bay and the Gulf of Mexico.
- 2) The need for hurricane season education, awareness and preparation for the citizens of the Fairhope/Mobile area.
- 3) The elimination of hunger within the Fairhope/Mobile area.
- 4) The need for volunteer action to support programs and services for non profit agencies within the service area.
- 5) The need for education about domestic abuse.
- 6) Support for, and education about, the arts and the role they play in our community.
- 7) The 2013 Mobile electoral race.

WZEW-FM offers extended airtime to legitimate public service groups through our liberal offering of airtime to legitimate public service groups. Public News/Lagniappe

WZEW has dedicated time to supporting news effort in partnership with Lagniappe weekly newspaper to cover news stories of public interest that go uncovered due to the area's lack of a daily newspaper. Topics covered include mayoral races, city council issues, Alabama's Open Records Laws, local art endeavors and more.

Bay Area Food Bank

WZEW-FM assisted in promoting multiple events to benefit the Bay Area Food Bank in 3Q to raise awareness and raise funds for the Bay Area Food Bank, whose mission is to end hunger in our area, beginning in May 2013 and throughout the end of 2013.

Mobile Mayoral Race

WZEW committed numerous air segments to discussion of the 2013 Mobile mayoral election, including recordings of live debates between the candidates, Sandy Stimpson & incumbent mayor Sam Jones. WZEW also used these opportunities to encourage voter registration and election voting.

Dog River Clearwater Revival

WZEW actively promoted DRCR events and clean up programs in 3Q 2013. DRCR focuses on cleaning and preventing litter and pollution in the Dog River area and throughout Mobile and Baldwin counties. Efforts have included children's education programs on pollution and responsible guardianship of natural references, cleanup days and promotion of installation of litter traps in the Dog River area.

American Cancer Society

WZEW served as a partner with the American Cancer Society in their efforts in Baldwin/Mobile counties to promote cancer research fundraising, anti-smoking efforts and other public information efforts to educate the public as to services offered by ACS. Penelope House

WZEW hosted numerous on air discussions and assisted in promotion of Penelope House, a local shelter for victims of domestic abuse. The Mobile/Baldwin area has many cases of this that go unreported and the promotion of Penelope House has helped increase awareness of the problem and what help victims can receive.

Hurricane Season

WZEW hosted on air discussion with local Emergency Management Agency personnel to inform the public of the impending hurricane season in the interest of educating the public on storm preparedness and how to locate appropriate disaster relief agencies if the need arises.

Red Cross / LifeSouth Blood Drives

WZEW partnered with The American Red Cross and LifeSouth Community Bloodcenters to assist in promoting blood donation year round and especially in times of need. Summer vacations always affect the local blood supplies, and efforts to inform the public were carried out numerous times.

WZEW-FM was a proud sponsor of Red Cross Blood Drives. Numerous blood drives were held during the 1stth quarter and WZEW-FM supported them with on air interviews, promos and appearances at the events.

Mobile Museums

WZEW promoted numerous events, programs and features of Mobile's major museums, the Museum of Mobile, the Phoenix Fire Museum, and the Mobile Museum of Art throughout 2Q 2013.

Military Veterans

WZEW has promoted national Veterans Affairs efforts to local veterans in our community especially veterans who are at risk for homelessness, most notably through the 877-4AID-VET hotline.

WZEW-FM airs the show “Community Round Table” along with the “Radio Health Journal” on Sunday mornings. “Community Round Table” is a local issues discussion show hosted by WZEW-FM host Ryan “Pablo” Foster. On the show he interviews community leaders and citizens of Fairhope and the surrounding area to find out what the issues affecting the community are and what solutions exist. The “Radio Health Journal” is a half hour (or 5 minute update depending on air week) program that focuses on new medicines and cure and suggestions and tips on how to live a healthier lifestyle.

STIMPSON CALLS FOR INDEPENDENT AUDIT ON CRIME REPORTS



Mobile, Alabama – Sandy Stimpson, candidate for Mayor, released the following statement regarding doubts raised about the reporting of crime statistics in the City of Mobile:

“Based on Sunday’s article in the Mobile Press Register, serious allegations have surfaced that involve the manipulation of crime statistics in the City of Mobile. This practice is terribly unfair to our men and women in uniform and to the citizens of Mobile.

The citizens of Mobile need to know who has condoned the practice of manipulating these important statistics - which are reported to the FBI - and why. Based on statistics, Mayor Jones has said he is ‘perfectly comfortable with where crime is in Mobile.’

A large majority of Mobilians are not comfortable with crime in our city and deserve for there to be an expedited independent audit of the crime numbers and the procedures producing them. Only Mayor Jones can call for this audit.

It is imperative our citizens trust Mobile’s leadership for an accurate portrayal of safety in our city.

As mayor, I will ensure complete transparency and accurate reporting of the city’s crime. Reporting inaccurate data for the sake of ambition or political gain cannot be tolerated.”

Please join other Mobile area concerned citizens to call on the City of Mobile to pass a resolution to protect the health, safety and economic well-being of local residents and natural resources by keeping tar sands oil out of the city. Tar sands oil, also referred to by industry as "bitumen", must be diluted with highly toxic chemicals to become "dilbit". It has to be heated in order to flow, and is impossible to clean up.

Canadian National Railroad Company (CN) is already shipping tar sands oil through metro Mobile's residential neighborhoods and downtown business area, with plans to eventually increase to more than 120 carloads of tar sand oil per day. That translates to more than 2 million gallons of oil entering the city every day. The danger to the community far outweighs any potential benefit.

Much of the toxic sludge will be stored in Arc Terminal tanks on Blakely Island. Because tar sands oil is a thick, asphalt-like

substance, trains will need to be unloaded using a steam heating process. The location of the tanks makes them especially vulnerable to catastrophic flooding. Residents are also concerned the toxic sludge will be shipped from the tanks through a more than thirty-year old existing pipeline under historic Africatown, Prichard and nearby communities, to 10-mile Terminal, before being pushed to Chevron's refinery in Pascagoula, MS through a controversial Plains Southcap pipeline, currently under construction.

Plains Southcap was given a federal permit by the Army Corp of Engineers, which the Alabama Public Service Commission (AL-PSC) also approved, with no consideration of public health and safety. As currently permitted, the pipeline will run from 10-Mile terminal, through the watershed of Mobile's drinking water reservoir, to the Chevron refinery in Pascagoula.
