The following are the issues of public importance identified by radio stations, WNSP, WZEW-FM, WZEW HD 2, and WZEW HD 3 in the 1st Quarter of 2021 for Mobile, Fairhope and the surrounding service area:

- 1) The improvement and protection of the environment in Mobile and Baldwin counties along with Mobile Bay and the Gulf of Mexico.
- 2) The need for funding and support of the Child Advocacy Center for victims of sexual and physical abuse within the Mobile/Fairhope area.
- 3) The need for volunteer action to support programs and services for non-profit agencies within the service area.
- 4) Support for, and education about, the arts and the role they play in our community.
- 5)) Updates daily on the Covid-19 Pandemic issues and information. We added 2 additional daily Corona Virus Update Reports on each station Monday Friday, at 1PM and 3 PM, and on the weekends at 8 AM, 12PM, and 5PM.




