discussion that there is a separate way to register your BUSINESS with Smart 9-1-1 so ANY call made to that number on your property will automatically refer to your business location! (news to us, and we registered WION while on-air!)

Thursday September 20th WION DONATES A 2 HOUR REMOTE at Ionia County Central Dispatch for their "open house." We set up a booth, talked to the Director of 9-1-1, Spoke with Ionia Sheriff's department, Local police department, and even an eye-donor/preservation organization. Penny Beeman co-hosted and helped "round up" the talent. This is an annual event for which we are proud to donate airtime.

Friday September 21st: WION is live in-studio as storms pop up on radar. Duratin: Around 2 hours of hosting music programming and watching the storms. As time went on, these storms popped up at Lake Odessa, and South/East of the city of IOnia.

September 24th: Ionia Public Schools asks WION to spread the word that the classes on the day of September 25th would be a short day, dismissing early due to the extended heat wave. Temperatures have soared above the 90 degree mark, hovering in the mid 90's most of the week. WION obliged with regular announcements the rest of this day and overnight on our station.

September 24th: MAde announcements about the 200-plus families without electricity during our heat wave. Consumer's energy was called, the reason for the outage was given as "trees."...we were given a 1:30 AM restoration time, which we included in our regular forecasts, and on our company Facebook page.

September 25th: Same notation on WION and the Ionia Public Schools' schedule. Heat wave continues. School dismisses with custom schedule. Notifications done in regularly scheduled (recorded) weather updates.

September 27th: Devoted about 15 minutes of the morning show to discussing the afternoon test of the Emergency Alert System, and that it will be heard on AM, FM, Cable, Satellite systems. WION filed it's paperwork as required this day with the FCC as well.

September 29th: WION welcomed the Ionia County Historical Society's Annette McCord to promote the upcoming Sunday's "Spirits of History Past" cemetery tour. This is a fundraiser for the historical society held in the cemetery on Ionia's East side. Duration: 25 minutes during morning show as co-host/guest.
