November 14, 2012:

Regular Penny Beeman Volunteerism visit. 1-2 hours.

Topics: FOOD DRIVE BIG-TIME. Discussed pickup of food at Belding and Ionia Middle Schools. "All food drive, all the time!"

Need of volunteers was discussed, as the coordination of sorting, counting, and unpacking was near, with the 16th being the day for all of this to take place at the lonia county ISD. Our plan was to have all the recipients at the ISD on the 17th.

Friday November 16th: "Food Drive Totals Discussed" on morning show. Duration: all morning, 6-9AM.

Saranac Elementary School students Trenton and Becka were live on the morning show with Vicki Kennedy. Total from their Saranac Food drive was: 1,258 pounds of food. This food drive was run exclusively by these two students, and held as a school competition. Video available of this on ustream.tv.

Suds Drive total discussed: 2 boxes of food, and \$125 worth of donations used to purchase cleaning supplies for the food drive and the needy. Cooperative effort with WION advertiser, "lonia Wash King."

November 21, (Wed with Penny) Topic: Food Drive recap. Duration: WHOLE SHOW, 6-9AM.

265 volunteers worked to collect, sort, regroup, 6,201 items in the WION/food net. drive, shared among 8 pantries. Total reported on teh morning show this date: 868 volunteer hours, \$825 in cash donations, 26 mini drive locations throughout the whole county collecting, and a HUGE thank you from WION and our food drive partners.

Announced our yearly "Christmas Carol" project in which our staff and friends reproduces the 1939 Christmas carol radio script for sale for charity. Will have show ready for sale by Christmas for families to enjoy.

December 5, 2012 Regular volunteerism visit With Penny. 1.5 hours.

Discussed: toys for tots. Medical Reserve corps and CERT helping with distribution at various locations. Offered information about Christmas concerts from schools across the area, most at the Ionia Theatre. Special attention to "Christmas in Ionia" which collected food as the admission fee, going 100 percent to local pantries.

December 24, 2012 WION ANNUAL CHRISTMAS EVE SHOW Duration 3 hours!!

Our annual Christmas Eve Show included open-door to the community, food provided by our staff and friends. Whole show was discussion of family traditions, seasonal decorations and 'all things Christmas." All Christmas music between breaks was played. We also debuted the new WION "A Christmas Carol" program, which was sold for charity. All local staff and friends of WION volunteered to play a "voice part" in this show which recreates the 1939 Campbell Playhouse version of "A Christmas Carol." Santa and Mrs. Claus came by, one elf, and a host of listeners including Ray Anne from Wash King, our (studios') nextdoor neighbor to the North, and others. Our GIFT to our listeners.
