Same notation here as in previous quarters regarding our regular services to the community including 24/7 CBS news, weather, the weekly church program, and monthly Chamber and DDA visits which may be also outlined in more detail below.

July 2nd: WION air this alert from Ionia County 9-1-1. This was received at 9:50 to WION... (especially important this weekend as traffic volume is UP and people are literally playing with FIRE)...

"IOCD's 911 lines are being transferred to Barry County. The glitch is being looked into. Please direct ALL calls to 616-527-0400 until further notice."

July 7th: (Thur) P. Beeman co-host with the latest info about Relay For Life that will take place this weekend in Saranac. Teams will be setting up camp on the 7th, kicking off the 24 hr event at 8am on the 8th, and continuing until 8am on the 9th. The entertainment committee has a great lineup of activities, including the introduction of a traveling trophy that will be used to celebrate team participation in games, contests, and theme laps. A listener also sent in a picture of the patchy fog that was in the area this morning, and we warned people to allow extra time and drive safely.

July 8th: Informed of a severe thunderstorm watch is in place through 8PM or until lifted for a LARGE part of Michigan including the WION over the air listening area. Reminded community members to safe for Relay for Life at Saranac, the Ionia County Historical Society's lawn sale at the Blanchard House or other plans, just be aware, and keep your radios handy! Later in the afternoon we alerted people that there is debris on M-21 West of Ionia, West of the prisons, mainly from very strong bursts of storms that were part of our severe thunderstorm warning which is in effect.. A second line of storms is likely to come through in a few minutes. If leaving to travel M-21 west was in your plans, a delay of a bit may be good. Please be careful!

WION received a nice note from a listener late this afternoon about our being LIVE in the studio for storms, unlike many bigger stations. Here's the note we received:To: Jim Carlyle

Subject: thanks for your weather info

Once I heard that the fairgrounds area was without power..! immediately called them. I am setting up now for the Ionia Free Fair and have lots of food in the fridge of the Floral Bldg.

They had some lines down...sent maintenance crew over to check the Floral Bldg.....then called me back to tell me to say home and not haul my food out of the fridge since that building still had power!

Aug 5th: Received picture from Officer Cronk, Ionia Public Safety of his dashboard radio tuned to WION Radio. Also introduced the all new "Comment Line" to be used for public comments, notes for on-air staff, reporting school info, sports results, etc.

Aug 10th: WION is proud to welcome Ron Wilson, new Ionia Public Schools Superintendent to our airwaves via phone in the 8AM hour to discuss the Open House that is taking place at Ionia High School. There will be a Community Forum in 2 available sessions that IPS is putting on (with refreshments) at 2 and 6 PM. September 10th: WION airs another new episode of our locally produced, "ionia Underground Audio" show, which showcases local bands, singers, and talent. This is a one hour show with no commercials, a cooperative effort between Main Street Music in Ionia and WION. Duration: 1 hour.

September 11th: Same notation, airing was late at night for those who missed it on Saturday.

September 15th: Bobbie Edlin of Green Acres Retirement Living co-hosts the Ionia morning show with news of their health fair and other improvements at Green Acres. Duration: 1 hour of regular co-hosting.

September 26th-30th: Homecoming Week at IHS, a different group of students from sports, to government, to music join the morning show each day including Principal Ben Gurk, and the Link Crew Students, too.
