Talked about the difference between city & county government & what the County Executive office oversees. Learned about new programs in the works – from increasing awareness and tourism in our green spaces, to why we are trying to get a community college here – to information about Blue Zone areas in the world (areas where many people are living healthfully into their 100s – because of certain factors) and how we would like to have that in our area. During heart month, we heard how the American Heart Association got started by a group of cardiologists in NYC, who wanted to expand research. Learned that they still have a mission to work on research, which, of course is shared all over the world. Talked about the importance of heart health for all ages, and how their advocacy arm has pushed for all infants to be screened for heart defects.. Reminded everyone about the staggering statistics of heart disease and how to know their family history – important health numbers (blood pressure, cholesterol, etc) Talked about warning signs for stroke and heart attack (for men and women, because they can be different) Heard about free tools online at their website, that the will come to your office for a lunch and learn – and got details about a health conversation coming up 29m57s.

Heard about the history of the Mission and how, although they began by helping men who worked at the docks, who suffered with alcohol addiction, they have expanded services. They have a shelter for men, as well as the New Life Program for men, but they also serve a community lunch for everyone. Learned about what items are best to donate and how to go about donating to the Mission – we heard about the 2 thrift stores and how they need items in very good condition to help those that are going without – or to put in their thrift stores for purchase. Heard that the exception to that rule is clothing an shoes. Although they do take the gently used items to put in their stores – they can bundle clothing and sell it overseas to earn money. 29m52s

Jim Tingley, Course Leader, Erie Power Squadron	North Coast Views Sunday, Feb 24, 2019 6:00am - 30 min	1 Reminded everyone about how the Power Squadron got started over 100yrs ago, in New England, and now has both a national, as well as local chapter –a group with a passion for passing on information about boat safety and certification classes for all forms of sailing, boating and jet skiing. Learned that instruction for the classes are free – as the instructors are volunteers, however, you do have to pay for materials (book and plotting tools) – you would have to pay for those materials online – this just gives you the personal touch, with the ability to ask questions.
