

2020 3rd Quarter Community Issues/Programs

During 2019, a survey was conducted by the Center for Marketing and Opinion Research to assess the community needs facing Akron and Summit County. The result of the survey is the 2019 Community Pulse report, which is provided to area agencies to assist them in focusing their services and programs where they are needed most.

CORONAVIRUS: During 1st quarter of this year, the Coronavirus Pandemic emerged as a #1 most important concern for all of our constituencies. As a result, all stations are airing regularly scheduled updates featuring the latest facts and statistics as we receive them. In addition, we are including announcements from local authorities, Ohio Dept. of Health and the Governor of the State of Ohio, as well as advice on best practices and advising listeners of mis-information which may from time to time be trending on other media.

BLACK LIVES MATTER: During the 3rd Quarter, we have seen continued local nationwide boycotts and demonstrations against racism and police brutality. RCRG Stations have included news and updates regarding these issues in their regular programming.

PRESIDENTIAL ELECTIONS: During 3rd Quarter, we have seen the election season heating up with great division occurring across the community. Plus, nearby, Cleveland hosted the 1st Presidential Debate at the Samson Pavilion on the Case-Western Reserve University Campus. RCRG Stations have included news and updates on the election in their regular programming.

Regularly Scheduled Programs

In addition to the programs listed, stations also provided the following regularly scheduled news and community service programming:

WAKR News – 3:00 length local newscasts 5am-9am M-F at the top and bottom of each of each hour 5:30a-8:30a and top of the hour following CBS News 9a-1p.

CBS News – airs on 1590 WAKR Newscasts are 6:00 in length until 9am M-F, with the exception of the World News Roundup at 8:00 a.m. M-F (10 minutes) and 1-min hourly updates throughout the day.

WAKR Ray Horner Show – 6:00 a.m. - 9:00 a.m. Monday-Friday. News, sports, weather, traffic, business and topical interviews of local, national and community interest.

America in the Morning - airs on 1590 WAKR 5a-6a M-F with topical news, sports, business and information. 54:00 length. Network program.

WONE News – 1:30 length hourly local newscasts 6a-8a weekdays.

WQMX News – 2:30 length local newscasts 5:30a-8:30a at the top and bottom of each hour weekdays.

Akron Weather Updates - all stations present weather updates at least every hour during live programming and break in to programming when severe weather events warrant.

Akron Traffic Updates - All stations: regular traffic and highway construction updates at least four times each hour on WAKR, WONE & WQMX during weekday mornings. Updates are provided weekday afternoons as needed.

Need To Know: one-minute news, community service and public service reports airing on WONE during varied rotations seven days a week.

Spectrum – produced by the RCRG Newsroom presenting in-depth treatment of local, regional and national issues. Some programs also include presentations of the City Club of Cleveland highlighting a wide range of programming. Airs on WAKR and WONE.

Forum 360 – produced by the Jewish Community Center of Akron in association with the Rubber City Radio Group, a 30-minute program airs each Monday morning at 12:30 a.m. on WAKR and Sunday at 6:30 a.m. on WONE at 5:30 p.m. on WAKR depending on sports schedules.

Center Talks – produced by the Akron Urban League and 1590 WAKR with information on agencies and programs of benefit to the Akron urban community. This program runs 30:00.

Ready, Set Grow - on 1590 WAKR with host Tom Dayton offering advice for gardening and landscaping. Saturday 8:00 a.m.-10:00 a.m. This program also airs Sunday evenings on a replay.

My Beautiful Home - on 1590 WAKR with hosts Katherine DeLong and Andy January with information on home décor and preserving value for homeowners. Saturday 11:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. This program also airs Sunday evenings on replay.

CBS Weekend Roundup - a 48:00 minute review of the week's biggest news stories. Program airs Sundays on WAKR.

CBS Face the Nation - a 58:00 program with news and debate originating in Washington, D.C. Program airs Sundays on WAKR.

RCRG Public Service Announcements

Need To Know is a :60 prerecorded public service announcement airing on an ROS (run of station) basis on 1590 WAKR and 97.5 WONE. A listing of the "Need To Know" topics covered in the Quarter are found at the bottom of this report.

Ohio Governor DeWine PSAs on Covid-19 aired during the quarter. These were aired on an ROS (run-of-station) basis on WAKR, WONE-FM and WQMX.

Ohio Dept. of Job & Family Services PSAs encouraging listeners who need to apply for unemployment benefits to do so online if possible because in light of lay-offs resulting from the Covid-19 virus, the toll-free line is experiencing extremely high volumes. These we're aired on an ROS (run-of-station) basis on WAKR. WONE-FM and WQMX, and included from time to time in regularly scheduled Coronavirus news updates.

RCRG Community Outreach

As part of our continued community outreach, RCRG works in partnership with various community groups to both raise funds and help operations of non-profit charitable groups and profile worthwhile community events. Among the initiatives for this quarter:

All Stations Participated in these Community Events

During the quarter, nearly all community events were cancelled or rescheduled. Our Community Outreach staff has maintained close contact with our local community groups in order to plan for activities that will return when health concerns are addressed. We have also assisted some organizations with their projects and "online" replacements for events.

Here are some activites which benefitted area organizations.

VIRTUAL HEART WALK

Held Saturday, August 29th and in support of the local chapter of the American Heart Association. RCRG stations aired promotional PSAs 5x/day for the two weeks prior to the online and socially distanced event.

VIRTUAL PET EXPO

This is a virtual version of an annual live event sponsored by RCRG stations, which is normally staged in June. This year, we staged it virtually, in September and it ran on the air and on line during the entire month. In connection with area pet shelters, we provided a platform for pet adoptions during the month.

VIRTUAL TASTE OF THE PRO FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME

In support of the Akron-Canton Regional Foodbank. The event was held Tuesday, September 29th. RCRG stations provided pre-recorded interviews promoting the organization's annual event, which was held virtually this year. RCRG stations also ran PSA Promos 5x/day during the 2-weeks leading up to the event.

SUMMIT COUNTY/ CITY OF AKRON CENSUS PSA's

This special PSA schedule encouraging citizens to participate in the Census ran during the period 5x/day.

WQMX Hosted or Participated in the Following Community Events:

WQMX COUNTRY PET RESCUE

This is an ongoing activity. For most of the period, WQMX worked with the pet rescue organization: "Pay It Forward for Pets". During August the program was expanded to include other shelters as well. On Thursday mornings, an adoptable pet is featured as well as a discussion of the need for homes for these rescue animals, especially during the COVID19 Pandemic.

WONE Hosted or Participated in the Following Community Events:

HUMANE SOCIETY OF SUMMIT COUNTY

This is an ongoing feature. Each Wednesday, during the 8am hour, the WONE Morning Show is visited by Colleen Brannigan, representing the Summit County Humane Society. Colleen always features to rescues available for adoption and discusses the shelter. During the period, Collen is participating via phone conversation rather than in-person studio appearances.

ROCK THE LOCK (DOWN)

Each summer, WONE partners with the City of Akron to sponsor this weekly event at Akron's Canal Lock "3". Each week, a classic rock "Tribute" band is featured on stage and WONE raises \$\$\$ for various charities. This year, WONE is producing a "Virtual" event, featuring the music of a single classic rock band during the evening.

WAKR Hosted or Participated in the Following Community Events:

All of WAKR's external community events were cancelled, or delayed, as a result of the social distancing orders. Our public relations staff continues to stay in contact with organizational leaders in order to pick back up when distancing regulations are changed.

Ray Horner Morning Show

This program airs 5:30a – 9:00a, Monday-Friday with the exception of major holidays. It provides regular newscasts, sports, traffic and weather in addition to a regular listing of community, news and topical interviews.
