But our mission is to be the icing on that cake, to bring art in that you normally would not see in this area," said Ehmann. "That benefits everybody." One of the featured pieces in the gallery is a handmade quilt, showcasing the results of intense racial period in our country. There are hundreds of names of African Americans who were lynched in the United States starting in the 1850s. "It's called 'Strange Fruit' after the Billie Holiday song, which is a very evocative, moving song about the tragedy of lynching. It's very moving. [The artist] said she had to stop about halfway through, because it was too emotionally overwhelming." There is plenty of artwork to enjoy at the exhibit, which runs until August 30th.
