He was charged with one misdemeanor charge for disorderly conduct for domestic abuse.

That's because WPS will be purging about 22 miles of a high pressure natural gas line between St. Germain and Three Lakes. They will be doing upgrades to the line. Nitrogen will be injected into the line in St. Germain. WPS workers will burn off gas as it leaves the pipeline in Three Lakes. People near Don Burnside Park in Three Lakes could smell natural gas odors and see a flame around five feet high both Monday and Friday morning.

Steimetz waived her preliminary hearing Wednesday. The court found probable cause to go forward with the case. She'll be back in court later this month.

According to the criminal complaint, a woman found him in her apartment with a gun. She told police she told Carlson in the past that he wasn't allowed in her apartment. She said she had her locks changed but forgot to lock the back door. Police shot a pepper gas like substance into the building. Carlson came out holding a cigarette in one hand and a bottle of whiskey in the other. He refused to tell police where the gun was. They found it the next morning under a pile of clothes. His bond is set at \$2,500.

Downtown Rhinelander - Revitalization Project Update	News	7-23-2-14	6, 7, 8AM Noon... 5PM	1 minute	<p>You can expect to see a major reconstruction in Downtown Rhinelander in 2016. The downtown area will improve its look and layout through a streetscape project. The new look could include wider sidewalks, outdoor restaurant seating and parking changes on Brown Street, but before any of that happens, city leaders need feedback from their community. Downtown Rhinelander Incorporated, already had surveys filled out by businesses in the area about parking on Brown Street. The construction company came up with a compromised solution. The proposal keeps Brown Street as a two way street, but there will be parallel parking on the west side and angled parking on the east side. That'll give us enough room to widen the sidewalks by five feet on each side and provide extra space for outdoor dining events for store owners to put displays out on the sidewalk, that kind of thing... said Vierhicher Associates partner Gary Becker. A bike lane will also be added to the west side of Brown Street, but it won't connect to anything outside of the downtown area. The city would need to work with the county to get trails connecting Rhinelander to the county system. The next open meeting will be September 24th.</p>
Yard of the Month Program	News	7-3-2-14	6, 7, 8AM Noon... 5PM	1 minute	<p>Summertime can mean a lot of yard work for homeowners. It's a time for people with green thumbs to show off their skills and to make flowers bloom. A group in Rhinelander wants to recognize people and businesses for their exceptional yards. Yard of the Month was introduced to Rhinelander by former city administrator Bill Bell. The community where he used to live had a similar program. So he approached Master Gardeners of the North to see if they would be willing to partner with the city. Robert G. Heck of Heck Capital Advisors takes his landscaping seriously. I've always liked landscaping. And we tried to put up a beautiful building here as kind of a gateway here into Rhinelander. Heck Capital Advisors is the recipient of the Commercial Yard of the Month award for July. That's an honor that Heck is really proud of... I love Rhinelander and we want to do well for Rhinelander... said Heck. This was a chance to set things up and maybe help the process along... This is the fifth year of Yard of the Month in Rhinelander. The city started the program to encourage beautiful lawns and to recognize those going even further. What they're looking for is something that is a little above and beyond... said Diane Del Rossi, a member of Master Gardeners of the North. If there's a lawn it needs to be neat and trimmed. We also look for nice use of shrubs and flowers. Three awards are given out each month. The Traditional and Blooming residence awards are given to homeowners with exceptional lawn and flower displays. There is also a Commercial Yard of the Month given to a business with an exceptional front yard in order to qualify as a Yard of the Month. Candidate your yard needs to be visible from the road. It's about what you can see when you drive by and how it enhances your neighborhood... said Del Rossi. Resident winners receive a certificate signed by the mayor and the city administrator. They also receive a sign that will be placed in their yard for the duration of the month. And lastly they receive a \$5 credit on their water utility bill. However commercial winners don't receive the credit toward their water utility bill. But to Robert, the recognition is more than enough. Master Gardeners of the North have already started judging the August nominees. They are also accepting nominations for September. The center has been open for two years now but it was the YMCA of the Northwoods not the school district that ran it. We had a three year contract with the YMCA. We were year number two with the YMCA. And that contract was terminated effective August 18... says Director of Business Services Marta Kwiatkowski. Aspirus has donated money. Therefore their name is on the wall and you know they have the naming rights for the fitness center. During the school year the fitness center is open before and after school Monday through Friday. The crew shot a chase scene in a Rhinelander cabin on Sunday. One of the principle ideas was to get away we're on the run. And I thought what a perfect place to be on the run... said Skubal. Try and be semi secluded where we might not be caught in a smaller town. The company plans to shoot a scene using our studios and some of Newswatch 12's reporters in the near future. Rhinelander's city council will vote in September on a proposal to change downtown Rhinelander. The original proposal would change the downtown's slanted parking spots to parallel spots. But people weren't happy with that... so only one side of the road will have parallel parking. That plan meant there wasn't enough room for bike lanes. If it was parallel on both sides that would give us enough to have bike lanes on both sides... says Downtown Rhinelander Incorporated Executive Director Maggie Steffen. You don't want to put a bike lane on just one side because then you can only go down one side of the street one way. It might get confusing. People might come up the wrong way and it becomes a safety factor. Project leaders say changes can still get made if the city approves this proposal... so there would be enough room for a bike path if the project returned to its original plan. But leaders say the city is instead looking at making Anderson Street a bike lane. I do know the city is working on a plan and it's always been there. We want to be a bike friendly community... says Steffen. And so they've been talking about making various trails because right now there really aren't any trails that connect right to downtown. The city council will vote on the proposal September 24.</p>
