-Senator Ben Sasse on Immigration

-Republican Water Decision

The supreme court ordered Nebraska to pay three point five million dollars to Kansas for use of water from the Republican River. A compact was written in nineteen forty three so Colorado, Nebraska, and Kansas would share water, Kansas users felt Nebraska was not allowing enough water down river, remedies of payment and a formula to allocate water to the three states would safeguard the compact, both should make the states live within it's law.

-Syngenta Corn Lawsuit

Another subject concerning local corn farmers in the lawsuit related to Syngenta's genetically altered corn seed. China had a ban on altered corn seed. The U.S. corn was collected together, but was rejected by Chinese officials due to the alteration. The corn market suffered and corn farmers are suing the seed company for their losses. Attorney Dave Domina is recommending farmers that used Syngenta MIR-one-sixty two seed obtain a reputable attorney before the statute of limitations runs out.
