## **Crime/Fire**

#### -Tax Evasion Outcome

A North Carolina man has been sentenced to more than four years in prison for evading personal income taxes he earned while living in Nebraska. Fifty nine year old Chat Lee West of Nebo North Carolina has been sentenced to fifty one months in prison. Once released, West will have to serve three years supervision. He also has been ordered to pay four hundred thirty nine thousand, five hundred and fifteen dollars in restitution. An IRS investigation revealed West had taxable income of around two hundred and seventy two thousand dollars while living in Omaha from two thousand and nine. West failed to file federal returns during that time. After being informed by the IRS that he was required to file returns. West submitted information to his employer claiming he didn't have to pay income taxes. West deposited personal income into bank accounts in the names of companies he created to hide his income from the IRS. West hadn't filed income tax returns since at least two thousand.

Enrollment in the University of Nebraska system has grown to nearly fifty two thousand student, the highest enrollment since nineteen ninety-three. Enrollment grew at the University Nebraska college of Technical Agriculture, the University Nebraska Omaha and the University of Nebraska Medical Center. Enrollment at the University of Nebraska Lincoln grew twenty five percent, a record enrollment at UNL

### -Bill to Expedite Citizenship Introduced

In June an Omaha police officer was killed while on Duty, Kerrie Orozco married Hector Orozco in two thousand and eleven. Hector was not a citizen of the United States. Senator Brad Ashford is proposing a bill that would allow the surviving spouses of first responders killed in the line of duty to more easily obtain citizenship. The bill is based on a current U.S. policy for the surviving spouses of military personnel killed in combat. It allows those spouses to apply for expedited citizenship. Senator Ashford wants the ballot introduced before the August recess, Kerrie and Hector have a child together and Kerrie was to begin maternity leave the day after she was died.

### -Alternatives to Property Tax Researched

Members of two key legislative committees are meeting this week looking at alternatives to property taxes to support schools. One idea is to keep state spending increases in check and utilize revenue above the state of spending to help pay for public education. State senator Roy

Baker of Lincoln says homeowners and property owners could see a rollback in their property taxes under the plan Other options include removing some sales tax on food because it tends to hurt those lower incomes. Taxing junk food has been discussed, another suggestion is expanding gambling, including online gambling, something Baker does not support.

# **Health**

### -Study Shows Work Causes Stroke

A new study shows that working long hours can increase your risk of stroke and heart disease. Dr. Pierre Fayad is the director of the Nebraska Stroke Center at the University of Nebraska Medical Centers department of Neurological Sciences and says this study shed light on how increased stress can impact the risk of having a stroke by thirty three percent and increase the risk of heart disease by fifteen percent. Dr. Fayad says working more hours could increase alcohol consumption, increase tobacco use, cause more stress and reduce the amount of needed exercise.
