DESCRIPTION: Scientists are linking a newly identified gene to breast cancer. Genetics expert Dr. Jeffrey Weitzel of the City of Hope Cancer in Duarte, CA says the PALB2 gene is less common than the much talked about BRCA genes, but it's almost as dangerous. A study in this weeks' New England Journal of Medicine says women with the PALB2 mutation have a 14 percent of breast cancer by age 50.

DATE: AUGUST 8, 2014

PROGRAMMING PROVIDED: MORNING NEWS

DESCRIPTION: For a third time, General Motors is recalling five makes of SUVs. GM says a power window switch problem could result in a fire, and it's telling some SUV owners to park their vehicles outside until they're fixed. The recall affects mainly 2006 and 2007 models of the Chevy TrailBlazer, GMC Envoy, Buick Rainier, Isuzu Ascender and Saab 97-X. GM says the necessary parts to fix the problem won't be ready until at least October.

DATE: AUGUST 13, 2014

PROGRAMMING PROVIDED: MORNING NEWS – 8:00 AM

DESCRIPTION: Cereal maker Kellogg thinks greener is better and it's taking more steps toward being environmentally friendly. In an effort to reduce carbon emissions in its supply chain, the Battle Creek, Michigan-based company says it will require key suppliers such as farms and mills to measure and publicly disclose their greenhouse gas emissions. It's also strengthening requirements for its own plants.

DESCRIPTION: The U.N. health agency says electronic cigarettes should be regulated and banned from use indoors until the exhaled vapor is proven not to harm people nearby. The World Health Organization also calls for a ban on sales to minors of the popular nicotine-vapor products, and to either ban or keep to a minimum any advertising, promotion or sponsorship.

DESCRIPTION: The Lancaster County Public Safety Training Center held it's annual Remembrance Service for the emergency responders who lost their lives on Sept 11, 2001. The service began at 9:30am at the Training Center, 101 Champ Blvd. in East Hempfield. The annual service is also an opportunity to remember the 46 Lancaster County emergency responders killed in the line of duty since records were kept.

PROGRAMMING PROVIDED: MORNING NEWS – 8 AM

DESCRIPTION: LANCASTER ONLINE reports tht at least one confirmed case of enterovirus 68 – the relatively rare respiratory illness that’s hospitalized hundreds of children around the country – has now been found in PA, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. From mid-August through Tuesday, a total of 130 people from 12 states were confirmed to have respiratory illness caused by enterovirus 68. The virus can cause coughing, wheezing and low blood oxygen levels. For youngsters with asthma or other respiratory conditions, the symptoms can be particularly severe. More states are expected to see confirmed cases in the coming weeks, as specimens continue to be tested, the CDC said. Exactly where the virus surfaced in PA was not reported.
