Segment 1: 00:00 – 07:55

Host Steve McCracken introduces Frank Gilyard, President of the Central Pennsylvania African American Museum, who offers a brief history of his museum's origin. A short montage of CPAAM b-roll follows. Frank mentions that his museum is a historical building with an original Underground Railroad runaway slave harboring pit. Next, Frank gives viewers his museum's contact information and mentions some other interesting artifacts that are on display.

Segment 2: 08:36 – 18:38

Frank continues discussing on the historical slave pit located in his museum's building. He mentions a man, Joseph Ross, who tended to runaway slaves 24/7 and guided them to their next stop. Steve asks Frank to speak on some of the other Underground Railroad locations in Reading. Frank says the first Berks County stop was Pine Forge. A short montage of Pine Forge b-roll follows. Frank says the next place runaways would go was Hopewell Furnace and describes what their travels involved. A short montage of Hopewell Furnace b-roll follows. Frank says the next place runaways would go was Joanna Furnace and talks about what their travels involved. A short montage of Joanna Furnace b-roll follows. Frank mentions some other Underground Railroad locations in the Reading area. Most were hotels and churches usually operated by free African Americans or known runaway slaves.

Steve asks Frank to explain the overall goals of a runaway slave which was to get to Canada because even all free states had slaves. Frank expands on a specific Underground Railroad stop near Hamburg called the Parvin Estate. He and a team of archeologists personally investigated this site and found numerous historical artifacts. A montage of Parvin Estate b-roll follows. Frank mentions his museum's annual Underground Railroad locations tour that is open to the public.

Segment 1: 00:00 – 10:16

Host Steve McCracken introduces Frank Gilyard, President of the Central Pennsylvania African American Museum. Steve asks Frank to share a brief history of his museum. Steve mentions the special Negro League Baseball exhibit on Frank's museum. Frank talks about the old players and teams from Reading that played in the league. Frank mentions a lecture given by Dr. Bob Allen at his museum on the history and importance of Negro League Baseball. He continues to mention some of the societal hardships players had to deal with at the time in history. B-roll of Dr. Bob Allen's speech follows where we hear him talk about his personal invested interest in Negro League Baseball, the stories of some players and how the league eventually fell apart.

Frank describes how local Berks County Negro teams got started and tells where they played. He mentions that today's National League is retroactively paying pensions to all living Negro League players. Steve asks Frank to list some of the larger Negro teams and describe what their travels were like. Frank mentions that players were rarely compensated with monies and were often paid with room and board.

Steve asks Frank to talk about the only woman to own a Negro League Baseball team who supplied her players with the compensations they deserved. Frank mentions a book, Only The Ball Was White, that tells of the personal experiences players had. He is eventually joined by James Weedon, fellow ex-player, who does the same.
