KMYI provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **AFFORDABLE HOUSING / EL CAJON EVENTS:** PART 1 - San Diego is one of the least affordable housing markets in the country. However, the nonprofit organization, Community Housing Works (www.chworks.org), says affordable housing can be found in San Diego and their organization can help. Jorge Vega (Vice President of the Realty Division) and KJ Koljonen, say that affordable housing can be found in areas such as Chula Vista, National City, Otay Mesa, Vista, Escondido and other areas. In fact, there can be properties in neighborhoods that might not be considered affordable at reasonable prices. CHW offers first time homebuyers step-by-step help on how to buy a home, home buyer classes, and affordable loans. CHW typically helps a middle-class home buyer that earns \$85K or less, and can find a home in the price range of \$200 to \$300K. CHW also has affordable rental properties. As a non-profit, their motto is "Mission before Commission," offering unbiased advice. - **CONSUMER ISSUES, SCAMS/IDENTITY THEFT:** Today's guest is Sheryl Reichert, CEO of the San Diego Chapter of the Better Business Bureau. The Better Business Bureau (BBB) collects and provides free business reliability reviews on more than 4 million businesses to over 100 million requests from consumers. The BBB serves as an intermediary between consumers and businesses, handling nearly 1 million consumer disputes against businesses in 2012. The BBB also alerts the public to scams, reviews advertising, and checks into charities. The BBB mission, to sum it up in a few words, is to advance trust in the marketplace. How do you do that? How does a consumer file a complaint? The BBB reviews charities, programs/services, and issues BBB Accreditation. Current consumer issues ... data breaches are not changing people's

habits. For example, the breach of the data from Target. An AP poll says nearly half of Americans say they are concerned; however, only 41% say they have checked their credit reports, changed passwords, or asked for replacement credit or debit cards. Strange \$9.00 charge on credit cards? This has been noted nationwide. Where is this from? (If this HAS happened, you have been hacked.)

In 2013, Wildcoast protected 350 miles of Baja coastline and a thousand acres of coral reefs in Mexico. The group manages over 17,000 acres of Marine protected areas in San Diego County and has helped conserve and restore over 15,000 acres at the US/Mexico border.
