Teacher Layoffs Bill

When Minnesota school districts get into financial trouble, faculty positions are often the place school boards look to to balance the budget. But the old rule of thumb – last hired, first fired – could be a thing of the past with legislation passed Thursday by the Minnesota House.

The bill gives more power to local school districts to decide which teachers are cut from the roster. Democrats say taking away teacher protections will almost certainly make the state's teacher shortage worse, especially in rural areas.

But Republican State Representative Bud Nornes, one of many co-authors of the bill, says students deserve the best teachers possible, whether young or old...

The bill has been introduced in the Senate and has been given a first reading.
